### COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Tuesday, May 10, 2022

The House Committee on Judiciary was called to order by Chair Filler.

Representative Mueller moved to adopt the meeting minutes from May 3, 2022. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

The Chair laid HB 5340 before the committee:

HB 5340 (Rep. Whiteford)

A bill to amend 1961 PA 236, entitled "Revised judicature act of 1961," by amending section 1082 (MCL 600.1082), as amended by 2012 PA 334, and by adding chapter 10D.

Representative Whiteford; Justice Beth Clement, representing the Michigan Supreme Court; and Susan L. Dobrich, representing the Courts / Public, testified in support of HB 5340. Questions and discussion followed.

HB 5508 (Rep. Tyrone Carter)	A bill to amend 1961 PA 236, entitled "Revised judicature act of 1961," by amending sections 8379 and 8396 (MCL 600.8379 and 600.8396), section 8379 as amended by 2000 PA 93 and section 8396 as added by 1994 PA 12.
HB 5509 (Rep. Puri)	A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code," by amending sections 682, 907, and 909 (MCL 257.682, 257.907, and 257.909), section 682 as amended by 2021 PA 50, section 907 as amended by 2020 PA 382, and section 909 as amended by 2000 PA 94.
