State Flag Adopted 1911

The Michigan legislature voted to adopt the state flag on June 26, 1911. The current design is usually considered to be Michigan's third state flag. There was no standard flag when Michigan joined the Union in 1837, but the earliest design used by the state included the Michigan coat of arms, and an image of Governor Stevens Mason. The first officially recognized state flag was unfurled in 1865 and displayed the Michigan coat of arms on one side, and the U.S. coat of arms on the reverse.

The 1911 law specifies that the state flag is to be 'blue, charged with the arms of the state' The Michigan coat of arms was designed by Territorial Governor Lewis Cass, and has been used by the state government since 1835.
