HB 4962 (Haines) Health; education; sudden unexpected infant death (SUID) and sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS) protocols; require department to develop educational materials and training program, require certain health providers to give to parents, and require parents to sign an acknowledgment of receipt.

A substitute (H-2) for HB 4962 was adopted at the Health Policy committee meeting on September 17, 2013.

Representative Callton moved to report with recommendation substitute (H-2) for HB 4962.
