





Agriculture: Gross Appropriations




FY 10 includes supplemental appropriations through January 10, 2010.

Agriculture: GF/GP Appropriations




Agriculture: GF/GP Appropriations FY 2009-10



Agriculture Share of State GF/GP


FY 2009-10 GF/GP Total = \$8,128,039,200


Agriculture Budget

State restricted funds, state GF/GP, and federal revenue are the largest revenue sources in the budget.



Agriculture Appropriations History

This chart shows the three primary sources of Agriculture appropriations



General Fund revenue support declined from FY 2000-01 to FY 2004-05. Federal revenue changes are due primarily to Emerald Ash Borer Program. Restricted revenue decline in FY 2009-10 reflects elimination of State Services Fee revenue in this budget.


Agriculture Spending

The agriculture budget is allocated into the following major spending areas:

- Executive/Administration
- Food and Dairy
- Animal Industry
- Pesticide and Plant Management
- Environmental Stewardship
- Laboratory
- Agriculture Development
- Horse Racing
- Capital Outlay

Agriculture Spending

Pesticide and Plant Pest Management is the largest spending component of the budget, followed by Laboratory, and Food and Dairy




PROGRAMS

Executive/Administration

- Executive/Administrative functions supported in the Agriculture Budget include funding for:
 - Agriculture Commission
 - Michigan Department of Agriculture (MDA) Executive Office
 - Other MDA administrative functions
- Departmentwide appropriation for rent and related property management charges
- Information Technology appropriation unit supports information technology work services and projects


Executive/Administration Share of Agriculture Budget



Food and Dairy

- Food and Dairy Division administers a comprehensive program to protect public from food-borne illness, from farm to table food regulation under the Food Law of 2000
- Protects against sale of adulterated food products, and fraud and deception in the sale of food products.
- Regulates production and sale of dairy products under Manufacturing Milk Law of 2001, and the Grade A Milk Law of 2001.
- Oversees local public health food safety inspection programs administered in conjunction with the Department of Community Health.


Food and Dairy Share of Agriculture Budget



Animal Industry

- Animal Industry Division programs protect public health and health of domestic animals under authority of the Animal Industry Act.
- State Veterinarian functions as division administrator.
- Division programs work to detect and eradicate animal disease, including Bovine TB, Chronic Wasting Disease, Rabies, Pseudorabies, and Eastern Equine Encephalitis


Animal Industry Share of Agriculture Budget



Pesticide and Plant Pest Management (PPPM)

- Funds enforcement of laws dealing with pesticide registration, use, and application certification and testing
- Develops strategies to monitor and control pests that are harmful to the state's horticulture and timber industry, including Emerald Ash Borer and other invasive species


PPPM Share of Agriculture Budget



Environmental Stewardship

- Supports programs to:
 - Prevent agriculture-related pollution
 - Preserve farmland
 - Promote environmentally sound farming practices
 - Enhance groundwater protection
- Administers Right-to-Farm Law
- Provides support for Michigan Agriculture Environmental Assurance Program (MAEAP)
- Administers Intercounty Drain Program
- Administers Migrant Labor Housing Program


Environmental Stewardship Share of Agriculture Budget



Laboratory Program

- The Department operates two laboratories
 - The Geagley Laboratory in East Lansing
 - The E. C. Heffron Metrology Laboratory in Williamston
- Department laboratories provides analytical, diagnostic, and technical services for other Michigan Department of Agriculture programs, as well as other state and federal agencies
- Supports Motor Fuel Quality testing
- Consumer protection program helps protects consumers from foodborne illnesses, toxic substances contamination, and economic deception


Laboratory Share of Agriculture Budget



Agriculture Development

- Supports programs related to marketing and promoting Michigan food and agricultural products, including:
 - Grape and Wine Industry programs
 - Select Michigan program
- Oversees 15 legislatively authorized commodity organizations


Agriculture Development Share of Agriculture Budget



Horse Racing/Fairs

- Office of Racing Commissioner
 - Regulates activities of the pari-mutuel horse racing industry in Michigan
- Fairs and Racing Unit
 - Administers grants for horse racing at pari-mutuel tracks and county fairs
- Provides state funding for horse racing purse supplements and other horse program grants under the Horse Racing Law of 1995


Racing Commissioner/Fairs Share of Agriculture Budget



Agriculture Capital Outlay Program

 Provides funding for Farmland and Open Space
 Development Acquisition Program under authority of Part 362 of the Michigan NREPA Act.
