### **Attorney General Responsibilities**

- Serve as chief law enforcement officer of the state
- Serve as legal counsel for state departments, agencies, boards, and commissions, and their officers
- Defend the state and state programs in court
- Bring actions and intervene in cases on the state's behalf
- Represent legislators and judges who may be sued while acting in their official capacities
- Issue opinions on questions of law submitted by members of the Legislature and others


### **Attorney General Budget**

Attorney General spending increases primarily due to inflation; decreases due to budget reductions. Increase in FY 2008 due partially to reflecting new funds in the budget which were previously provided by other departments.




### **Attorney General Share of State GF/GP**

## Attorney General Share of General Government GF/GP


FY 2009-10 GF/GP Total = \$625,194,200

### **Attorney General Spending**

- Department operations
  - Attorney and staff salaries and benefits
  - Contractual services, supplies, and materials
  - Rent and building occupancy charges
  - Expert witnesses
  - Travel
  - Equipment
- Staff in Child Support Division and costs associated with increased child support enforcement activities
- Information technology-related services and projects which support Department activities; administered by the Department of Information Technology

### **Attorney General Spending**

- Prosecuting Attorneys Coordinating Council: \$2,038,700 Gross and
   11.0 FTE positions
- Autonomous agency responsible for ensuring that a uniform system of conduct, duty, and procedure exists amongst prosecutors throughout the state
  - Publishes legal documents
  - Provides manuals and other materials on criminal prosecution and practices
  - Provides updates on legislation and court procedure changes
  - Provides research assistance
  - Administers grant-funded services
  - Coordinates statewide prosecution activities and office automation
  - Provides for continuing professional education
