
#### **State Board of Education**

—The Michigan Constitution


#### Department of Education Share of State GF/GP

#### **Department of Education Appropriations**



#### **Department of Education Revenue Sources**






# **STATE SPENDING**

#### **Budget Description**

- The Department of Education provides:
  - Technical assistance to schools
  - Curriculum standards
  - Accreditation standards
  - Administration of state aid to school districts
  - Assessment test administration
  - Compliance with federal "No Child Left Behind" Act
  - Teacher certification
  - Grants to schools and local educational organizations
  - Clearinghouse for school safety issues
  - Library of Michigan services to state government and the public
  - Administration of state aid to libraries

#### **Four Largest Units**

- School Improvement Services: \$18.2 million
   Facilitates school district compliance with state and federal school improvement requirements, including the "No Child Left Behind" Act
- Library of Michigan: \$16.4 million
   Provides reference services to Executive, Legislative and Judicial branches as well as the public. Administers State aid to Libraries and provides assistance and training to libraries.
- Schools for the Deaf and Blind: \$13.7 million
   Provides MI residential educational services and programs for deaf and blind students at the schools in Flint
- Special Education Services: \$11.5 million
   Oversees the administrative funding of education and early
   intervention programs and services for young children and
   students with disabilities
