The fiscal information in this background briefing is based on data through January 1, 2010.

Legislature

- Enacts laws of Michigan, levies taxes, and appropriates funding from revenue collected for the support of public institutions and the affairs of state government
- Initiates and considers amendments to the State Constitution, considers legislation proposed by petitions signed by voters, and considers proposed amendments to the U.S. Constitution
- Exercises legislative oversight over the Executive branch of government through the administrative rules and audit processes and through committees and the budget
- Legislative branch of state government includes:
 - House of Representatives
 - Senate
 - Legislative Council and agencies it governs
 - Legislative Retirement System
 - Property Management


Legislature Budget

Legislature spending increases due primarily to inflation; decreases due to budget reductions.




Legislature Share of State GF/GP

Legislature Share of General Government GF/GP


FY 2009-10 GF/GP = \$625,194,200

STATE SPENDING

Legislature Budget

- Legislature: \$78,919,400 Gross
 - 100% state GF/GP funding for day-to-day operations of:
 - House of Representatives
 - Senate
 - House and Senate Fiscal Agencies
 - House and Senate computer systems
- Legislative Council: \$11,028,100 Gross
 - 96.4% state GF/GP and 3.6% private funds for day-to-day operations of:
 - Legislative Service Bureau
 - Legislative Council Facilities Agency
 - Legislative Internet Technology Team
 - Legislative Corrections Ombudsman
 - Michigan Capitol Committee
 - Joint Committee on Administrative Rules
 - Michigan Law Revision Commission
 - Michigan Commission on Uniform State Laws
 - State Drug Treatment Court Advisory Committee
 - Provides essential services, such as bill drafting and research, to legislative members and staff
 - Pays Legislature's dues for national associations and worker's compensation premiums

Legislature Budget

- Legislative retirement: \$4,533,900 Gross
 - 75.5% state GF/GP and 24.5% court filing fees
 - Membership in system limited to legislators employed before March 31, 1997; legislators employed after that date are members of the Defined Contribution Retirement Plan
 - Health insurance costs for deferred and retiree members of the system;
 retirement allowances, survivors' allowances, and other benefits for
 legislators, their spouses, dependents, survivors, and beneficiaries
- Property management: \$11,793,300 Gross
 - 100% state GF/GP funding for operation, maintenance, and repair of the Cora B. Anderson Building (House property) and the Billie S. Farnum Building (Senate property)
 - Under authority of the Michigan Capitol Committee, Legislative Council Facility staff manage, operate, develop, construct, maintain, renovate, and repair the Capitol Building and grounds
