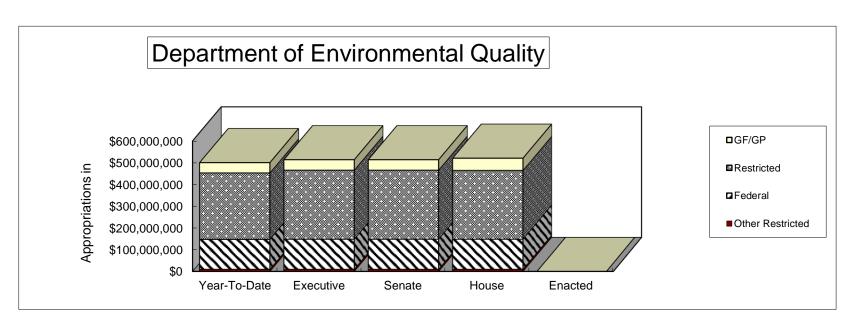

At a minimum, the age of the facility should be considered, as well as fixtures that are high risk, such as drinking fountains, ice makers, kitchen taps, or any other fixtures that deliver water commonly used for human consumption. The strategic statewide plan shall also identify the proper sampling and analysis protocols for testing for lead in water and measures for reducing lead exposure as recommended by the United States Environmental Protection Agency. If test results demonstrate lead levels that are not in compliance with state or federal standards for safe drinking water, the department may collaborate with the school to implement a plan to reduce lead levels in that school's drinking water.

- (3) Not later than October 1, 2016, the department shall provide notice to all public and private prekindergarten through twelfth grade schools of the strategic statewide plan and the application process for reimbursement of voluntary testing for lead in water.
