COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Tuesday, June 14, 2022

The House Committee on Judiciary was called to order by Chair Filler.

The Chair requested attendance be called:

Representative LaGrand joined the committee remotely.

Representative Mueller moved to adopt the meeting minutes from June 7, 2022. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

The Chair laid HB 6124 before the committee:

HB 6124 (Rep. Bollin)

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law," by amending sections 31, 683, and 730 (MCL 168.31, 168.683, and 168.730), section 31 as amended by 2012 PA 271, section 683 as amended by 2018 PA 120, and section 730 as amended by 1995 PA 261, and by adding section 730a.

Representative Bollin testified in support of HB 6124. Questions and discussion followed.

HB 5487 (Rep. Tisdell)	A bill to amend 1976 PA 331, entitled "Michigan consumer protection act," (MCL 445.901 to 445.922) by adding section 3o.
SB 1023 (Sen. Victory)	A bill to amend 1976 PA 331, entitled "Michigan consumer protection act," (MCL 445.901 to 445.922) by amending the title and by adding sections 3n and 3o.
SB 1024 (Sen. Hertel)	A bill to amend 1976 PA 331, entitled "Michigan consumer protection act," by amending section 3 (MCL 445.903), as amended by 2021 PA 46.
