COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

The House Committee on Rules and Competitiveness was called to order by Chair Lilly.

The Chair laid HB 5477 before the committee:

HB 5477 (Rep. Stone) A bill to regulate the preparation, distribution, and

sale of kratom products; to prohibit the

preparation, distribution, and sale of adulterated or contaminated kratom products; to provide for the powers and duties of certain state governmental officers and entities; to prescribe fines and

penalties; and to provide remedies.
