Dear Chairman Lilly and distinguished committee members,

On behalf of Michigan Justice Advocacy, I am writing you today to voice support of House Bill 4670, otherwise known as Productivity Credits. We applaud Representative Kahle, Slagh, Posthumus, Tyrone Carter and Calley for their efforts to introduce constructive and positive incentives into laws pertaining to those in the custody of the Michigan Department of Corrections. The benefits of positive incentives such as those promoted by HB4670 are numerous and well documented; reducing misconduct both while incarcerated and post-release, higher likelihood of success upon reentry into society, reduced recidivism, improved odds of employment and greater public safety to name a few. These results can also be measured in economic benefits to society.

But more importantly these incentives are good for the restoration of individuals who have broken the law and wish to make amends. By providing a means for someone to demonstrate their desire to change and equipping them with the skills for success we all benefit. Neighborhoods benefit from returning neighbors who have renewed self-esteem and a new sense of purpose.
