



Arsenal of Democracy



The Defense of our nation and Michigan has been linked since 1940 when FDR called on U.S. Industry to create the armaments needed for WWII. Chrysler opened the Warren Tank Plant in 1941 creating a Government-Owned, Contractor Operated (GOCO) facility.^a



Michigan Defense Center

- Created by Statute in 2006
- Attached to MEDC
- Work Closely with DMVA, Detroit Arsenal, and other DoD missions
- Coordinating organization for defense industry strategy for the state
- Working closely with economic development partners around the state
- Manage relationships with defense community and associations




Concerns that sparked a statewide initiative

- New and emerging technologies




Getting P&G Started

Concern for vulnerability of Michigan's defense industry and assets led to a statewide strategic initiative.






Protect & Grow Helping to Drive Unity of Effort




2017-2019 REVENUE = \$8.8 MILLION






