In case I am unable to have the opportunity to speak, I enclose the entirety of my enclosed speech.

I apologize if this statement is not as well thought out as I would like. I found out about this hearing yesterday while I was at work and composed this in a matter of hours because I feel that strongly and I am that concerned. I dislike public speaking but I felt that if I did not try to make my voice heard and did everything in my power to protect my right to choose and the right of so many others that I would forever regret it. I am a 38 year old mother of three, and I vape. Like so many others of my generation I picked up cigarettes at a young age. The main reason I did so wasn't for the flavor of cigarettes, but because I wanted to look cool and I saw other people doing it who I wanted to fit in with. I frequently got older people to buy them for me, or took them from my parents and as I was tall and looked older was frequently able to buy them for myself. Years later when I was an adult and saw the health effects starting to show up, I, like so many others tried to quit. I tried the gum, the patch, Wellbutrin and had the worst effects when I tried Chiantix, all to no avail. Then I found e cigarettes. When I first started vaping I was still smoking, and did try the tobacco flavors. It slowed me down, a little, but as most of the tobacco flavors weren't very good, they did not replace my cigarettes. Then I tried wintergreen e liquid, and was surprised that I really liked it, as I had rarely smoked menthol cigarettes. Over the next 2-4 months my cigarette consumption went from almost 2 packs a day most days, to 1 pack, then to only 6 cigarettes. I made rules for myself associated to the habits I had refusing to smoke after meals, in cars, with my coffee. I can't tell you the day I quit as I just tapered off. I knew I had finally quit when I was out and I bummed a cigarette when my vape died and knew I didn't want it anymore. That was the first time in my life that a cigarette was NOT what I really wanted. I do not know if I ever would have gotten to that point if there had only been tobacco flavored vape juice available. When I began vaping I was well over 300 pounds, on multiple medications, and my PFT (pulmonary function test) was only 79%. This means that for someone my age, my lungs only operated at less than 80% of what they should. I had a hard time, at just over 30, with keeping up with my youngest children. I have now lost over 100 pounds, have a PFT of over 100%, no longer need most of those medications, and thoroughly enjoy playing tag with my children.

I also wish to address something that has been mentioned but largely overlooked in the media. Vaping is a verb and can be used to describe an action taken to inhale various substances. My heart goes out to the hundreds of people afflicted with pulmonary illnesses from vaping what has largely been understood to be black market items, many or all of which had the. These are not the FDA regulated nicotine vape juices that are for sale by brick and mortar establishments. In fact, of the over 500 nicotine juices turned in for evaluations, NONE had vitamin E acetate, a dangerous substance when inhaled. I am very concerned that if the regulated options are removed from the market that many will turn to dangerous black market alternatives putting their health in very real danger. Nicotine vapes have been used for years by millions of people with no major ramifications and it was only recently, with unregulated items, that there were negative consequences. I am not stating this to say that vaping is safe, or healthy or by any means to encourage anyone who never smoked to vape. I am stating that through the adult consumption of regulated nicotine juices that harm can be reduced by vaping over consumption of traditional combustible tobacco. Numerous public health organizations including Public Health England, the Royal College of Physicians, American Cancer Society, the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine, and FDA have acknowledged the reduced harm of ecigarettes and vaping devices in comparison to combustible tobacco use; I am simply reiterating that fact.

I also feel the need to address the fact that the teens that are vaping are breaking the law. I applaud Governor Whitmer for addressing the need for legislation on making it officially illegal to sell minors e cigarettes and e

liquids. The previous laws were written prior to the e cigarette industry and the loophole needed to be addressed. I would like to think that all adults in all retail locations were being responsible and refusing to sell to minors, but I am aware that may not be the case. I think it could be taken further and have stiffer penalties enforced on those that violate the law. I also applaud restricting advertising of vapes and think it should be taken further to restrict the advertising of all age restricted items in areas that are frequented by underage people. I think it could be taken even further and move all tobacco, e cigarettes, alcohol, ALL age restricted items to stores where only adults can enter. This would take exposure to e cigarettes and the even more harmful tobacco and alcohol completely out of the businesses that are frequented by children and teens. It would leave a smaller selection of places to acquire items and have employees that have had it emphasized that they card everyone that looks under 50, or of any age regardless of how they look. History has shown us however time and time again that prohibition has never been the answer, and I don't think it will be this time either. I think it is more important to strengthen and enforce the laws we currently have rather than imposing new ones that will primarily harm law abiding adults trying to reduce the harm they experience.

I know hundreds of people that have quit smoking with e cigarettes and ALL of them use flavors other than tobacco. I am not just here to state my concerns, I am here to display the other side of the facts and to propose a compromise that addresses the real and valid concern of underage vaping. I strongly believe that reducing flavor options for adults will have many negative consequences without having much effect on underage vaping and nicotine consumption. I have even ensured that I made a references list and am happy to produce it with the hard copy of this statement. I also thoroughly agree with continued research on the long term effects of e cigarette use. I do not contest that abstinence is the healthiest choice and should be the ultimate goal, but as cigarettes are still readily available and prevalent in our society, I don't believe that harm reduction options should be removed from adult users. The Royal College of Physicians, an organization of over 32,000 doctors in the UK have found a 95% harm reduction in the decade of e cigarette consumption, but we don't have the multiple decades yet that we do with traditional tobacco. I obviously have a vested interest in this research and hope to see it progress in the future.

11 million adults in the US currently vape. In response to the FDA ANPR, an internet survey was conducted of almost 70,000 adult e cigarette users. Almost 95% were previously smokers and 92% used e cigarettes at the time they ceased smoking. Only 20% of these stated that they used tobacco flavors. 72% of those surveyed credited interesting flavors with being a primary factor helping them to quit. In a 2015 study of over 27,000 vapers, almost 70% of the people who had successfully and completely guit smoking used non tobacco flavors. In fact, the only group of e cigarette users that predominately used tobacco flavors were those that were still smoking cigarettes daily and had not yet made the switch completely off of cigarettes. In a separate study done by the Harm Reduction Journal of over 20,000 e cigarette users over 76% had completely quit cigarettes. These adult users identified using fruit flavors (73.9%-82.9%), dessert flavors (63.5%-68.8%) and Candy, chocolate or sweets (48.7%-53.4%) as their primary flavors. Flavors are appealing to adults trying to do less harm to themselves, because it makes it a more enjoyable proposition to try to quit. Addressing the concern of cigarettes as a gateway to other more traditional tobacco less than one tenth of one percent of those who had never smoked before e cigarettes picked up a cigarette after first trying e cigarettes. So few in fact that those doing the study addressed that it did not cross the minimum threshold of 0.5% required for statistical significance. Also interesting, was that less than 1% of those surveyed used prefilled cartridge based systems such as the Juul, Alto and Blu and over 99% used refillable tank or pod systems. However many of the teens surveyed identified these style of devices as their unit of choice due to their ease of use and ability to conceal them. I find there is a much higher correlation between the type of device than the flavor of juice utilized. I am not trying to demonize any company, solely pointing out other possible correlating factors that may be more useful in addressing the teen vaping epidemic.

As I have concerns as both a parent and as an e cigarette user I do want to point out some other statistics that I feel may pertain although not directly related. While 37% of senior high school students identified themselves as vaping at least once in the past year, 17.5% admitted being drunk within the last month and drinking 5 or more alcoholic beverages within the past 2 weeks before being surveyed in December of 2018. The good news is, that was actually an improvement over the 26% that had consumed alcohol within one month of the

survey 5 years ago. There was no massive flavor ban on alcohol in that time frame, and yet there was a marked improvement in the teens surveyed. Stricter alcohol laws, more education of students and less prevalent advertising however were instituted during that time frame. As there are over 4,300 deaths annually of underage users of alcohol I believe there is still more that can be done in that arena as well. And yet, I hear no one proposing a ban on cotton candy vodka, or attacking Svedka for using child friendly flavors such as cherry or blue raspberry to try to attract underage users. I am not suggesting we do that, as prohibition has generally lead to more cost to citizens in the long run, and does not work. But I do believe that as there is far more research supporting the health risks of alcohol, that the hypocrisy should at least be addressed.

I also feel the need to address the economic ramifications of instituting this ban in Michigan. There are hundreds of independent small businesses in Michigan surrounding vape and e cigarettes. This will affect thousands of jobs, families, and millions in revenue for the state. There are not only the retailers but multiple vape juice companies that are based in Michigan and provide jobs and income to many of it's residents. More unemployed people will lead to a higher drain on welfare programs while simultaneously decreasing tax revenue. There are tens of thousands of e cigarette users that not only are reducing their harm but spending significantly less on vaping products than they would on their more traditional tobacco counterparts. That is without mentioning that 9% of what the government spends on healthcare in the US is directly related to combustible tobacco consumption. According to the CDC it gets worse when adjusting for government sponsored programs, stating, "9.6 percent of Medicare spending, 15.2 percent of Medicaid spending and 32.8 percent of other government healthcare spending by sources such as the Veterans Affairs department. Tricare and the Indian Health Service, were attributable to smoking." E cigarettes have grown to an over 12 billion dollar industry in the US but unfortunately does not touch the 500 billion of the tobacco industry in the US, a more harmful product that is not being adequately addressed. When this topic was broached in Washington, Representative Hurst warned that a "vaping prohibition will simply cause a black market to form that is more dangerous than what politicians are trying to stop. This hurts the economy by generating revenue that is outside the traditional tax system and by clogging up the legal system with otherwise law-abiding citizens." This also puts e cigarette users at greater risk by making their only flavored option being an unregulated substance, which is exactly what is causing all the horrible life threatening consequences we have seen all over the news in recent weeks.

I do not just come before you as a concerned citizen but hopefully, also as a voice of reason proposing compromise that I believe will address concerns on both sides of the issue. I come before you as not only an e cigarette user, but a parent that hopes beyond hope that my children make better decisions than I did at their age and avoid all nicotine consumption. Some of these suggestions I have taken from other countries or smaller areas that appear to be making headway in addressing this epidemic.

- 1. I propose moving ALL age restricted items to facilities restricted to adults. Have e cigarettes and all forms of tobacco available only in adult only tobacco shops. I would prefer to see this done with alcohol as well. Then teens and children will have far less exposure to any and all substances restricted to adult users. This will also help to prevent massive and untenable economic losses by both small businesses and manufacturers that an all out prohibition of flavors would cause.
- 2. Plain box packaging on all age restricted items. This limits appealing colors or advertising if children encounter these items outside of an adult only established, when being consumed by adult users using these products.
- 3. Limit advertising for age restricted items to age-restricted areas.
- 4. Stiffer penalties, financial and legal, for those adults found selling or providing an age restricted substance to a minor.
- 5. Possibly consider raising the age of e cigarettes and all tobacco products to 21. This will minimize high school seniors buying it for younger high school students. It will also increase the likelihood that those adults who do purchase said items are more mature and better able to evaluate their decisions to not participate in usage of or distribution to someone younger than required by law.

I thank you for your time and consideration. I sincerely hope you will strongly consider choosing a different alternative than banning flavors from adult constituents trying to choose a harm reduction strategy.

Your flavor ban won't affect me, since I buy flavorless juice in bulk and add food flavors (water soluble, no oils). Please don't send Michigan back to the dark ages. If you need to ban anything, please ban packaged vape pens sold in gas stations. Those are the ones the kids are getting their hands on. I am a 61 year old woman who smoked cigarettes for 40+ years and wanted to quit due to shortness of breath and coughing. I went to a specialty vape store for advice. They helped me choose a device and also a nicotine level that would be equivalent to what I was smoking at the time. They advised away from tobacco flavors, citing it is too close to cigarettes and may not help with quitting. I did not smoke another cigarette after the first vape puff. Three years later I have reduced the nicotine level from 12mg to 1.5mg. The shop also helped with the rate of reduction. I don't cough anymore, I don't have shortness of breath anymore, my good cholesterol levels went way up and my preventative lung scan was one of the clearest they have seen. I don't like the too sweet flavors, but use a tropical flavor, melon or peach. I have never tried a tobacco flavor, but menthol is terrible and I would assume tobacco would be also. Dear Committee Clerk Thrush,

I started smoking when I was ten. My father smoked, as did his mother, 2 of his older sisters, and two of his older brothers. Sad to say, but I liked smoking... but hated what it was doing to me. Coughing and hacking in the morning, constant stuck phlegm in the throat feeling, irritated eyes from the smoke, shortness of breath, and getting winded from moderate exertion far too quickly and frequently.

In 2013 I went in for a vasectomy and my doctor was the one that drove home the importance of quitting smoking. He said, "though you smoke outside, and your children don't see you smoke, they still smell it on you. Mommy and Daddy love me, mommy and daddy keep me safe, mommy and daddy smell like smoke, smoke is safe." That hit me hard. I explained to him that I tried the gums and the patches to no avail. I have an addictive personality, so cessation drugs were not an option. Plus, I knew people who had taken them and WOW! Even without my issue I don't think I'd have tried them. The hallucinations, and nightmares sounded crazy! I wasn't about to let some knucklehead turn me into a pincushion, and in my opinion most therapists need therapists. He laughed, winked in agreement. And suggested vaping. I proceeded to spout off all the concerns and fears the media was propagating. Each shot down with medically proven fact or ease of treatment in comparison to treating tobacco related illnesses. Honestly, after the conversation and all the information he had to offer, I felt dumb for thinking vaping was as dangerous as smoking.

So I went to the gas station I'd seen them at and bought a rechargable Blu cig-a-like kit. They offered cherry, peach, vanilla, tobacco, and menthol flavors; in 4 nicotine levels, high, medium, low, and zero. In my opinion, cherry and peach were their best. After about a month I noticed I could smell stuff I wasn't used to smelling, further away, and with more intensity. Food began tasting way better than it had, and don't get me started on desserts! Lol. I also realized how bad smoking made me smell. Bleckgh! I could smell it on my clothes hanging in the closet, my coats, in my truck...and on my wife as she was still smoking. After about 2 months with my Blu, I ran into some quality control issues paired with lack of customer support and got a little bitter. I actually began entertaining the idea of going back to smoking, if for no other reason than to avoid the frustration, when a coworker suggested a vape device that takes e-liquid. It's refillable, the flavor never runs out, there are way more flavors to choose from, greater variety of nicotine levels for step down, and just way more options. So I bought and ego vape pen with wild cherry e-liquid. That year I tried tons of different flavors. I didn't want to taste tobacco ever again. I wanted to avoid the possibility of temptation even though my restored senses were already against it. Smoking is not just a physical addiction, its mental and emotional as well. You get angry, you walk away and have a cigarette. Despite the fact that walking away from the thing that angered you is what helped, because you had a cigarette the mental correlation was made...smoke to calm down. Have good sex, smoke a cigarette...the emotional correlation is made. Smoking is "icing on the pleasure cake."

In that time, I also discovered that vapor volume was important. I began mouth-to-lung (MTL) like smoking, but the inhale/exhale volume sensation wasn't satisfying. In short, I wasn't getting enough vapor to mimic the same sensation as inhaling/exhaling tobacco smoke. So I upgraded my vape for direct lung (DL). I gradually went to a regulated tube mod, to a single battery regulated box mod, to what I use now...a dual battery programmable mod. It affords me the versatility of being able to put on an MTL tank and stealth vape for large crowded areas, or put on a DL tank for the vapor volume I prefer.

The point is, without the wide variety of e-liquid flavors and products, I would not have been able to stay off tobacco. Yes my vaping evolved with the technology, but only to achieve my "perfect vape" better and safer. I learned how to make my own e-liquid to save cost, but also to better know what I am inhaling. Plus, no one makes nectarine/mango/strawberry/ marshmallow e-liquid.

There's an old saying...variety is the spice of life. If you took away all flavors of ice cream and left only vanilla would watching your favorite I wanna cry movie" curled up on the couch with a bowl be the same? Get rid of all candy bars

except plain Hershey's, would you be satisfied without a snickers? No more whoppers or big macs only regular hamburgers. I'm sure you get my point. I'm 42 years old. I like candy, fruit, and dessert foods. Fruit flavors are my preference for vaping, but once in a while a hubba bubba flavored vape (nostalgia) or cappuccino flavored vape (coffee lover) is a pleasant change...like a treat.

Teens have found ways to get cigarettes and start smoking long before vaping existed. Flavor was obviously not the cause for picking up the habit. Most of the time, the reason was to be cool...or rebellious. Smoking kills over 480,000 people per year in the U.S. alone, and claims over 41,000 lives due to secondhand exposure. A regulated box mod can produce plenty of vapor, even for a vape trick competition. Though vaping is not 100% safe, it is scientifically proven 95% safer than smoking with zero secondhand exposure risk. Like I said, teens have been smoking for years regardless of illegality. If they are going to pick up a habit for whatever reason, I'd rather they vape. Vaping regular e-liquid has killed no one. Improper ingredients in cannabis vapes have killed 4, and is the cause of the recent lung issues that have been happening. Reasonable, responsible regulations for the betterment of vaping and its efficacy in cessation is what's needed. Cigarettes should be banned. But there are alot of tobacco companies, and their stocks. Cessation products/treatments and their stocks. Choose life over profit. Help improve vaping, don't aid in it's destruction. Help fix the problem, don't limit the tools for overcoming it.

Dear Committee Clerk Thrush,

I am a totally blind 44 year old person, and I got off ciggarettes in just 14 days thanks to vaping. Before I started vaping, I was on average a two pack a day smoker. I tried other methods like the patches, gums, and lozenges. None of those worked for me. When I heard about vaping in September of 2017, I talked to a few friends of mine threw twitter about it, asking lots of questions about vaping, where I could buy the juice, and hardware,, how safe it was, web sites that had information so I could do my own research, and there personal thoughts on how it worked for them.

I did a lot of thinking about smoking VS Vaping. What were the benifits I would get if I switched to vaping. Another thing I thought about was the cost between the two. I also thought about the health improvement I could get. the fact I could have less nicotine in my system, and if I wanted too, I could even eventually get myself to 0 nicotine too. I also thought about the fact that sometimes I would drop hot ashes on myself, so another improvement for me was the safety aspect as well. I thought I would give it a try, so September 16, 2017, I went to a local shop in Marion, Ohio, and purchased my first vaping kit, and different flavors of EJuice. I was offered tobaco flavored EJuice, but right away said no thanks, as I didn't want any type of taste, or smell reminding me of ciggarettes. I knew that if I was going to be successful with this, I wanted nothing flavor, or smell wize that would remind me of ciggarettes. During the next 14 days, I fell off the hourse a few times, but from September 16, 2017 4:00 PM, threw September 30, 2017 I only had about 15 ciggarettes total, and 95 percent of those were ones I got off a friend, or a family member because they were at my house smoking.

Here it is September 11, 2019, and even being around the smell of a ciggarette makes me think to myself, "I actually used to smoke those?" I haven't had one tobaco flavored EJuice threwout my whole vaping journey, and 99 percent of the EJuice I have vaped has had 3MG or less of nicotine in it. I am very proud of myself, but Thanks to this proposed flavor ban, things could be a lot harder on me. While I don't think I would go back to ciggarettes, because the smell right now is not one I like, if I am unable to get EJuice anymore, I could be tempted.

I really don't think that a flavor ban is going to solve the problem. In fact, I personally think it could make things werse. I could see people trying to make there own juices, and selling it to people, but with that not being regulated, god only knows what could actually be in the EJuice wich could make people sick, or werse. I personally think that we need to find other ways to keep teenagers from vaping. If they are buying it from stores, and a store is caught selling it to a teen, punish the store, not the intire vaping comunity of Michigan. If they are getting it online, then parents need to step in, and help so they are not purchasing it online. I know that could be a lot harder to stop, but I just don't see how banning flavors is really going to stop teens.

Another thing I see happening is a lot of people that vape could go back to smoking, witch is something we wouldn't want at all. If you take flavors away, and all they can get is tobaco flavor, they might just say "how is this helping me? if I want this taste, I would just go back to smoking." My name is Shane and I'm a former smoker. I started smoking at age 14, and smoked 1.5 packs a day for 16 years, and was only able to quit with vaping.
