Language Equality & Acquisition for Deaf Kids (LEAD-K) is a critical movement where we assert that language deprivation or delay from birth to age 5 is the main cause of Deaf children's eventual academic and social struggles. Why is it critical! Because of misguided and misinformed principles, policy and ideology, Deaf children frequently arrive at Kindergarten without adequate language skills to undertake academic challenges.

Our Deaf children who are visually oriented, do not get full access to the language. American Sign Language (ASL) is the visual language with a rule-governed system used to convey messages. Unfortunately most school programs are more focused on hearing and speech therapy. As a result, this delays Kindergarten readiness. Most medical approaches seek a cure. It causes a critical period of acquiring a language.
