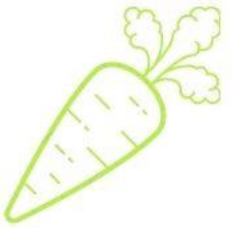




CCBHC Expansion Sites

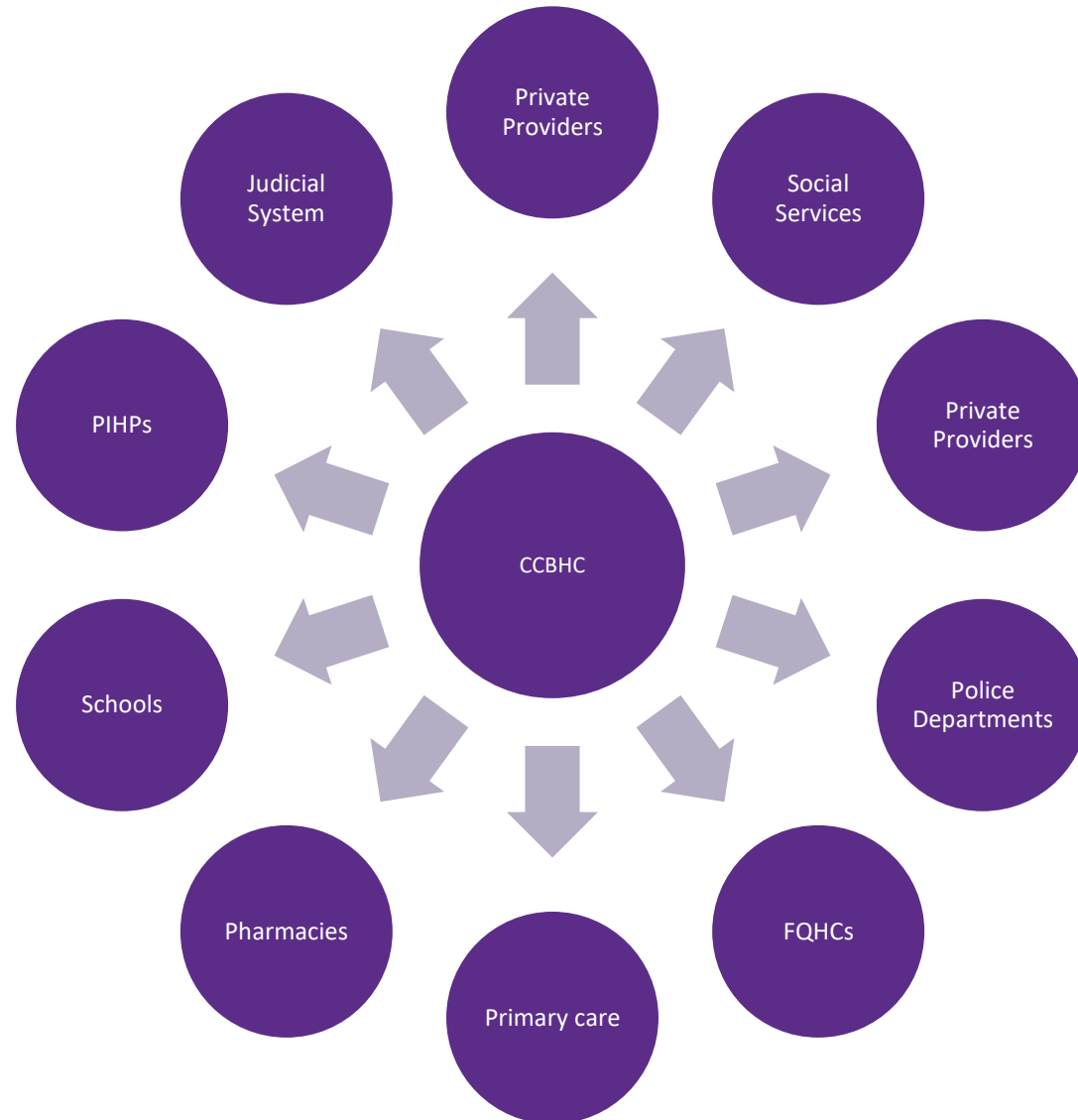

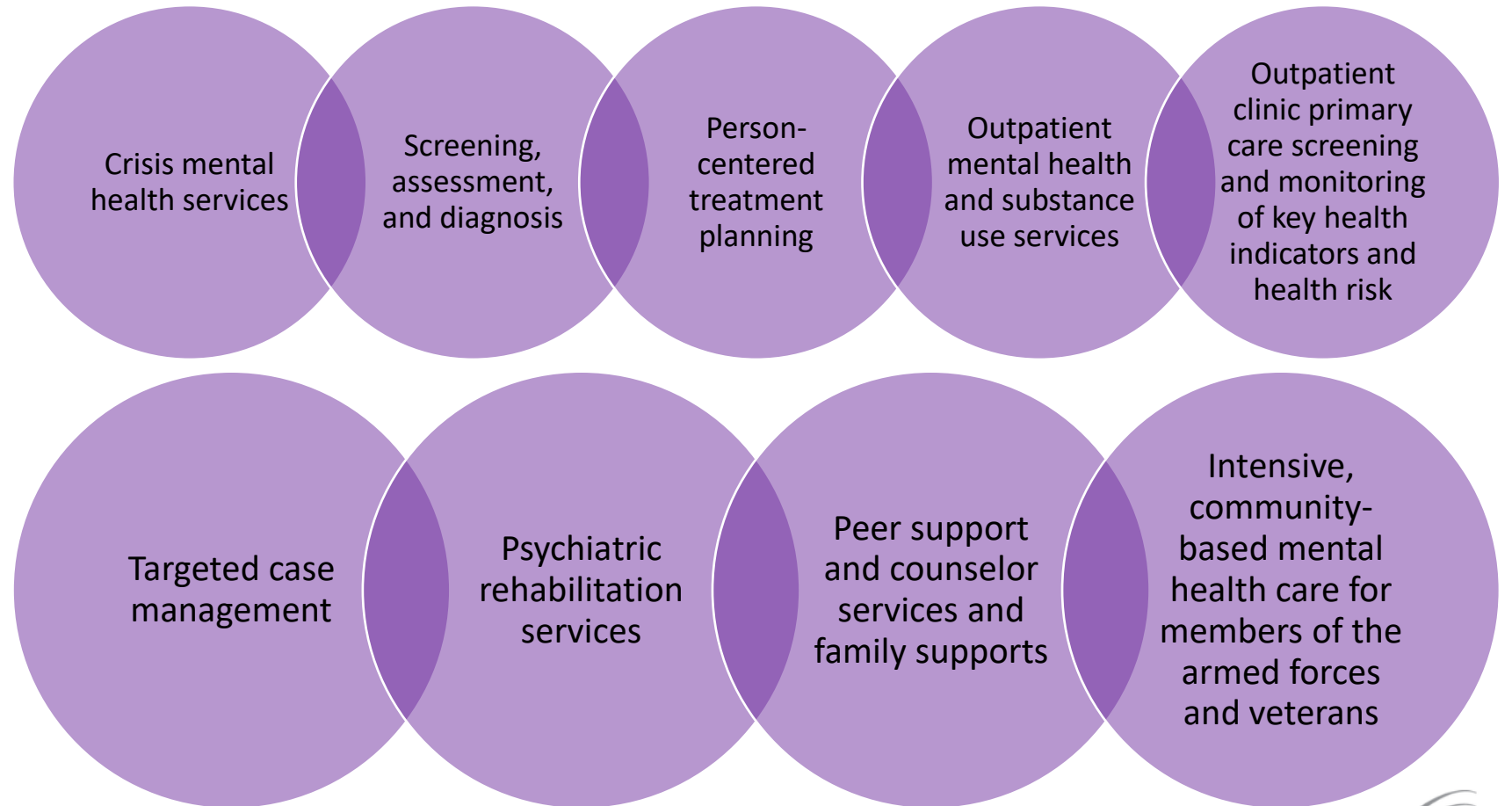

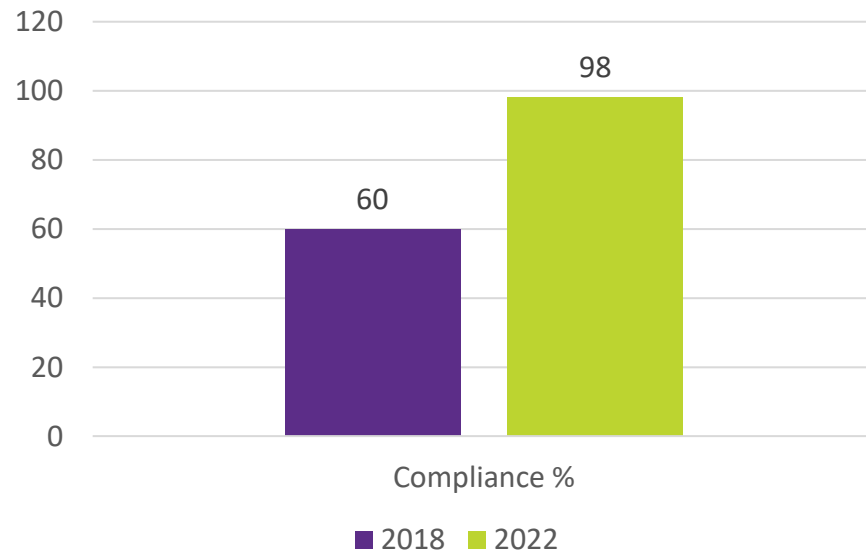

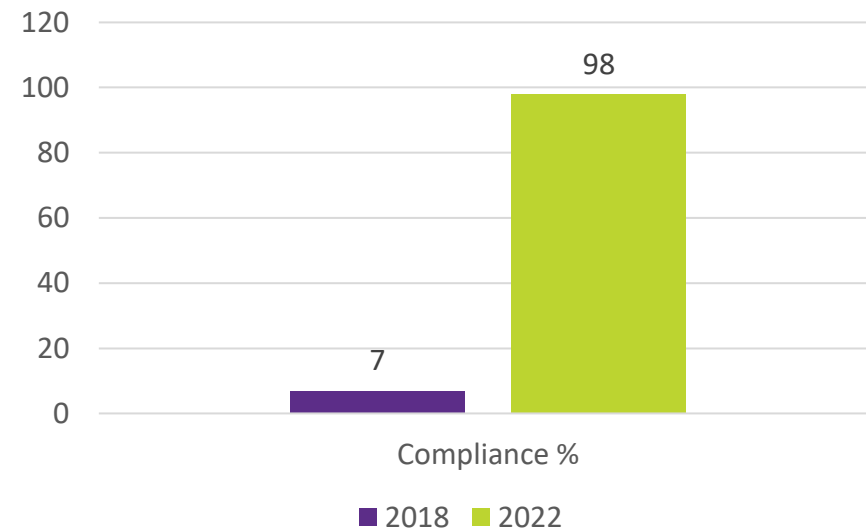
Adult Major Depressive Disorder (MDD) Suicide Risk Assessment

Severity of Depression Screening (PHQ9)


Using our care pathways and standardized screening and assessment tools, we have seen a decrease in depression symptoms among those screened .




Improved Outcomes for Suicide Attempts and Deaths

Crisis Response and Law Enforcement Partnerships

CCBHCs are uniquely positioned to serve as a cornerstone in our nation's new crisis response system, decreasing the burden on 911 operators, law enforcement officials, and emergency departments.

CNS' Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) brings together clinicians, law enforcement, and emergency dispatchers. The primary goal of this program is to assist those who may be experiencing a mental health crisis, suffering with substance use, or homelessness. The CIT program works toward reducing jail recidivism with this population by providing law enforcement with evidence-based training with jail diversion alternatives
