When I was younger.....

- I never wanted to read or write. Actually, I wanted to read and write because I liked school, but I just couldn't.
- In 3rd grade the teachers wanted us to read out loud and I was afraid I would make mistakes or take too long.
- They didn't give me good strategies to sound out words. They said to go back and slide through the word, which didn't help because I wasn't sure what sound the "a" made, was it a long "a" or a short "a"
- They only had me read a book and talk about what I remembered from the book BUT it was hard to remember since I couldn't read all the words.
- Teachers didn't spend a lot of time on writing and spelling.

- While I was in elementary school, I sometimes felt out of place almost as if I didn't belong at school or in the class.
