The twenty-six Michigan Chapters of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated are writing to voice opposition to House Joint Resolution (HJR B). We believe it will disfranchise Michigan citizens from voting. Further, many of our members are married and we are deeply concerned that married women voices will be regulated to Provisional Voting when there is no reason to doubt our citizenship because of our marital status. We are also concerned about the impact of this resolution on Returning Citizens who frequently have difficulty securing documents such as birth certificates and state identification.

Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated is a private, not-for-profit organization whose purpose is to provide assistance and support through established programs in local communities throughout the world. The sorority currently has 1,000 collegiate and alumnae chapters located in the United States, Canada, Japan (Tokyo and Okinawa), Germany, the Virgin Islands, Bermuda, the Bahamas, Jamaica, West Africa, Southern African, United Arab Emirates and the Republic of Korea.

There are several other points that we believe will make the passage of this bill punitive and disfranchising:

- We should make it easier for citizens to vote, not more difficult. The current voting system in Michigan works. This resolution will take Michigan back several decades and exclude too many Michiganders from voting
- There has not been creditable proof of widespread voter fraud in Michigan or any place in the United States.
- States that have passed citizenship requirements have deprived too many people from their right to vote.
- · Fear mongering and using the racial trope of undocumented persons voting is decisive to the citizens of Michigan and disruptive to harmonious and productive Michigan.
- · Two years ago, the citizens of the state voted to incorporate the existing voting identification law into the Michigan Constitution. HJR B will set voting rights back in Michigan.

We urge you to vote against HJR B. This resolution threatens to undermine the democratic process and disenfranchise countless Michigan citizens. The right to vote is fundamental to our democracy, and it is our collective responsibility to protect it.

HJR B also requires a systematic review of the qualified voter file to check the citizenship status of currently registered voters, giving voters only 60 days to address questions before their removal from the QVF.

Michigan voters are already required to affirm or verify their citizenship status when registering. It is illegal for non-citizens to vote in elections. Election officials have systems to verify an individual voter's eligibility and ensure that voter rolls are accurate.

Please vote "No," on HJR B and assure that every eligible Michigan citizen has the right to vote.

While ostensibly this resolution was designed to protect elections from votes by non-citizens and ensure election integrity, in practice these laws have disenfranchised some of the most underprivileged citizens.

When a similar law was passed in Arizona, it made it harder for legitimate citizens to vote, including college students, indigenous people, and homeless people, who are more likely to not have the proper documentation at the ready to prove their citizenship. These populations were around 3 times less likely to vote in the November 2024 election: https://www.votebeat.org/arizona/2024/12/13/arizona-voter-citizenship-proof-law-shows-groups-struggling-to-provide-it/

HJRB risks disenfranchising a great number of citizens, many of whom are impoverished or underprivileged. This would undermine their most foundational right under our republic: the right to choose our representatives in government, the idea that the United States was founded on.
