revised school code," by amending section 1249 (MCL

380.1249), as amended by 2018 PA 235.

SB 0202 (Sen. Horn) A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The

revised school code," by amending section 1249b (MCL

380.1249b), as added by 2015 PA 173.
