HB 4226 (Rep. Berman) A bill to amend 1961 PA 236, entitled "Revised judicature act of 1961,"by amending section 3240 (MCL 600.3240), as amended by 2014 PA 431.

1. Amend page 2, line 20, by striking out **"\$200.00"** and inserting **"\$250.00"**.
