The House Standing Committee on Ways and Means was called to order by the Chair Iden.

HB 4271	(Rep. Howell) A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code," by amending sections 1278a and 1278b (MCL 380.1278a and 380.1278b), section 1278a as amended by 2018 PA 232 and section 1278b as amended by 2018 PA 230.

HB 4282 (Rep. Hauck) A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The

revised school code," by amending section 1278a (MCL

380.1278a), as amended by 2018 PA 232.
