Due to the recent increase in nutritional food insecurity, Double Up has supported a more than 100% increase in 2020, including empowering 412,000 families to double their fresh fruit and vegetable purchases. Double Up benefits Michigan fruit and vegetable growers, shippers, packers, and retailers by expanding local markets for their products, as well as ensuring that Michigan families in need have access to affordable fruit and vegetable nutrition for their families. With the closure of schools, hungry kids are also able to access the Double Up nutrition incentive.
