The House Committee on Commerce and Tourism was called to order by Chair Wendzel.

The Chair laid HB 5425 and HB 5426 before the committee:

HB 5425 (Rep. Witwer) A bill to amend 1967 PA 281, entitled "Income tax

act of 1967," by amending sections 51f and 711 (MCL 206.51f and 206.711), section 51f as added by 2017 PA 110 and section 711 as amended by

2018 PA 118.

HB 5426 (Rep. Tisdel) A bill to amend 1984 PA 270, entitled "Michigan

strategic fund act," by amending section 9 (MCL 125.2009), as amended by 2017 PA 109, and by

adding chapter 8F.
