The House Committee on Elections and Ethics was called to order by Chair Bollin.

The Chair requested attendance be called:

Representative Whitsett moved to adopt the meeting minutes from May 4, 2021. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

Representative Wendzel moved to adopt the meeting minutes from May 11, 2021. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

The Chair laid HB 4690 and HB 4691 before the committee:

HB 4690 (Rep. Kahle)

A bill to amend 1978 PA 472, entitled "An act to regulate political activity; to regulate lobbyists, lobbyist agents, and lobbying activities; to require registration of lobbyists and lobbyist agents; to require the filing of reports; to prescribe the powers and duties of the department of state; to prescribe penalties; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts," by amending section 5 (MCL 4.415), as amended by 1986 PA 83.

HB 4691 (Rep. Sabo)

A bill to amend 1978 PA 472, entitled "An act to regulate political activity; to regulate lobbyists, lobbyist agents, and lobbying activities; to require registration of lobbyists and lobbyist agents; to require the filing of reports; to prescribe the powers and duties of the department of state; to

prescribe penalties; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts," (MCL 4.411 to 4.431) by adding section 7a.

HB 4839 (Rep. Paquette) A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan

election law," by amending section 759 (MCL

168.759), as amended by 2020 PA 302.

HB 4840 (Rep. Borton) A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan

election law," by amending sections 811 and 847 (MCL 168.811 and 168.847), section 811 as

amended by 2018 PA 603 and section 847 as amended by 2012 PA 271.
