






Changes in Voting Modes









Voter Registration











- WY: Established voter ID requirements
- AR, MT: Made voter ID requirements more strict



Early In-Person Voting








Early In-Person Voting



- IN, KY, LA, OK: Expanded # of days
- IA: Shortened # of days
- GA: Standardized # of days
- GA, TX: Limited certain types of early in-person voting



- KY and NY: Established an online absentee ballot request portal
- NY: Moved return deadline from the day before Election Day to Election Day
- IA: Removed "postmarked by" date
- OR: Added "postmarked by date

Ballot Collection



IA, KY, MT: Limited whocan return ballots

FL, GA, HI, IA, IL, KY, MD, MN,
 VA: Made a variety of
 security, quantity, and
 location changes







- 44 states have some kind of ballot tracking system
- IA, NY, TX, UT: Passed legislation to establish ballot tracking systems







- 37 states allow processing to begin before Election Day
- IN, LA and ME: Passed legislation to begin processing earlier

- 23 states allow voters to cure their ballots
- IN, KY, TX, VA, VT: Created ballot cure processes



Ballot Cure Processes







 AZ, AR, FL, GA, ID, IN, KS, ND, OH, TN, TX: Prohibited or limited the use of private funds in elections




- AR, GA, IA, TX: Created new penalties for local election officials
- AZ, KS, LA: Made it a crime to impersonate an election official
- AZ, LA, NY, TX: Established new training requirements

Post-Election Audits



- KY, TX: Established risklimiting audit pilot programs
- NV: Revised its risk-limiting audit pilot
- AL: Required one-time postelection audits in 2022
- NH: Created committee to study post-election audit counting devices



- AZ, AR: Prevent unauthorized access to election systems
- AR, MT: Require studies and/or election security assessments
- WA: Exempts election security information from public records requests

Ranked Choice Voting

Pro-RCV bills passed in CO, GA, ME and UT.



Poll Workers & Watchers

13 enactments in 11 states.



Voter List Maintenance

19 enactments in 14 states.



Felon Voting Rights

CT, NY, and WA restored voting rights to citizens on parole.
