COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Tuesday, November 2, 2021 9:00 AM Room 519, House Office Building

The House Committee on Judiciary was called to order by Chair Filler.

Representative Mueller moved to adopt the meeting minutes from October 26, 2021. There being no objection, the motion prevailed by unanimous consent.

HB 4699 (Rep. Pohutsky)	A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled "The Michigan penal code," by amending section 5201 (MCL 750.5201), as amended by 1988 PA 138.
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Representative Pohutsky testified in support of HB 4699.

sections 7103 and 7105 as amended by 2018 PA 664, and by adding sections 5301c, 7408, 7409, and 7409a; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

HB 4899 (Rep. Filler)

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code," by amending section 236 (MCL 257.236), as amended by 2000 PA 64.

HB 4900 (Rep. Bolden)

A bill to amend 1998 PA 433, entitled "Michigan uniform transfers to minors act," by amending sections 10 and 11 (MCL 554.530 and 554.531).

HB 4901 (Rep. Bolden)

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending section 80312 (MCL 324.80312), as amended by 2000 PA 65.
