## 1. Testimony for Michigan House Bills 5267 and 4270

As a resident of the great state of Michigan and a senior at Cass Technical High School, I am incredibly proud to support House Bill 5267 and 4270. According to a May 2021 study, nearly 1 in 4 students in the United States struggled to purchase period products or were not able to purchase them at all this year.
