I am a resident of the state of Michigan and a Nursing student at Macomb community college and Wayne State University. I am incredibly proud to support House bills 5267 and 4270. As a woman and a college student I know that many students go without period products because they simply cannot afford them. Having to pay a tax on something that is medically necessary is a huge burden. Women should not have to pay extra of their hard-earned money on taxes for something they have no control over. Think about your daughters, mothers and sisters that have had to pay taxes on their period products for 39 years. During your period you use roughly an 18-count box of tampons, some maybe more.
