BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY OF PROPOSED RULES

Rule Set 2022-62 LR would make numerous amendments, additions, and recissions to the rules pertaining to the program for utilization of unused prescription drugs. The changes would accomplish the following:

- Add and modify definitions.
- Allow electronic duplicates of records to be used two years after original records are made.
- Allow facilities and manufacturers to submit substantively similar donation forms for forms required to be sent with shipments to pharmacies.
- Allow participating pharmacies to submit substantively similar forms for all forms required by the program.
- Allow pharmacies to repackage donated drugs.
- Establish requirements for drug repackaging.
- Modify requirements for participant, donation, transfer, and destruction forms.
- Require that handling fees collected by pharmacies from drug recipients not exceed the costs of participating in the program.
- Modify requirements for accepting temperature-sensitive drugs.

FISCAL IMPACT OF PROPOSED RULES

2022-62 LR would have an indeterminate fiscal impact on the state Medicaid program, with no anticipated impacts on other state and local government units. LARA indicated that any increases in the utilization of this program may result in savings on prescription drug reimbursement costs for the state Medicaid program. Because participation is voluntary for both pharmacies and eligible individuals, any cost changes would depend on utilization and the quantity and type of donated drugs.
