### **Meeting Workforce Needs**

in programs like Aviation and
Marine Technology.

High-Demand,

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#### **Aviation**

- Time to complete program: two years (associate degree); 131 students
- Typical starting salary: \$70,000+
   plus sign-on bonuses of \$50,000+
- Job Opportunities: pilot for airlines, corporate or charter aircraft, air freight industry, air tours, pipeline patrol, air ambulance, ferry aircraft for brokers and dealers, professional flight instructor

#### **Marine Technology**

- Time to complete program: four years (bachelor's degree); 50 students (178 in GLMA)
- Typical starting salary: \$75,000-\$85,000+
- Job Opportunities: mapping/hydrography, marine construction, exploration, science/research, environmental monitoring

- Making the Michigan <u>Achievement</u>
   <u>Scholarship (including CCG) permanent</u>
   (552 Students @ NMC)
- Making <u>Reconnect Expansion Permanent</u>
   (649 Students @ NMC)
- Support Community CollegeOperations Funding (4%)

### Why Investing in Infrastructure Matters

- Safety and technology upgrades are needed to meet <u>modern standards</u>
- Aging and functionally limited facilities limit <u>program expansion</u>
- Limited <u>housing is a barrier</u> for enrollment

an investment in infrastructure is an investment in student success





## Addressing Facility & Housing Needs: Innovative Solutions



### **One-Stop Shop Student Services Hub**

- Student Success vs. Bricks & Mortar (centralized student services = satisfaction/retention/success)
- FY26 Capital Outlay Request (Ranked 3rd in State)
- \$8 million dollar total project cost



## Addressing Facility & Housing Needs: Innovative Solutions



#### **Getting Results with ITEMS**

- Safety and technology upgrades are needed to meet modern standards
  - Geothermal Power Plant to replace steam boiler system
- Aging and functionally limited facilities limit program expansion
  - Aviation Hangar expansion
  - Reducing a two-year long waiting list
- Limited affordable housing is a barrier for enrollment
  - Purchase of off-campus <u>Apartment Complex</u>
  - \$1.1M of \$3.6M cost funded by ITEMS
  - Increased housing by 50 beds
  - Estimated new build = \$7.5 million



# State Support for Facility and Housing Needs

#### So, what can the legislature do?

- Establish ongoing ITEMS funding to help community colleges <u>improve infrastructure</u>, <u>upgrade technology and equipment</u>, <u>ensure</u> <u>safe and well-maintained facilities</u>.
- These investments are <u>foundational</u> to Michigan community colleges' ability to provide accessible, affordable, and high-quality education and training.
- FY26 Request: \$45 million
