Legislatively directed funds totaling \$5.4 million would be used for critical infrastructure needs at Memorial Healthcare, a nonprofit independent community hospital founded in 1921 located in Owosso, Michigan. Beyond its status as the sole hospital in rural Shiawassee County, Memorial also serves numerous communities across greater mid-Michigan providing of family medicine and specialty outpatient services across six counties.

Proposed funding is targeted toward the most urgent needs at the main hospital facility, including the replacement of the central boiler system, modernization of HVAC across three hospital wings, and upgrading of sanitation and domestic plumbing.

This funding will significantly assist with the sustainability of Memorial's ongoing efforts to provide services at its main campus as well as surrounding communities during a time of increasing cost pressures. Facilities improvements will preserve critical patient access to healthcare in numerous rural and underserved areas across mid-Michigan. Memorial Healthcare's positive impact as an independent community hospital touches the entire state, with residents of every county in Michigan represented as patients over the past two years.

PROPOSED: One-time funds totaling \$5.4 million for critical infrastructure upgrades

Memorial Healthcare is a 104-year-old rural independent hospital located in Owosso in Rural Shiawassee County with nearly 40 additional ambulatory outpatient locations throughout Shiawassee, Bay, Clinton, Ingham, Livingston and Saginaw Counties. Memorial Healthcare has been recognized nationally and at the state level by industry leaders for excellence in meeting or exceeding patient care standards as well as for its use of technology to address patient care, patient safety and service quality.

As Memorial Healthcare continues to address numerous facilities needs in a challenging fiscal environment, infrastructure investment support is essential in our ability to provide uninterrupted healthcare services to the patients we serve.

The following are critical needs:

Boiler system modernization: \$2.4 million

Replacement of main hospital boiler, condensate receiver and deaerator system to restore consistent function, create greater efficiency and eliminate patient care disruptions.

HVAC modernization: \$1.5 million

Upgrade of 3 wings of hospital HVAC system, heat exchangers and hydronic piping to ensure smooth temperature management and further air and water particulate infection control.

Sanitation and domestic plumbing upgrades: \$1.5 million

Line and/or replace century-old cast iron drain and sanitation lines and remaining galvanized water lines restoring consistent pressure and efficient function while eliminating the potential for soil contamination.

Support for these infrastructure investments on our campus will ensure continued patient access while directly contributing to Memorial's long-term sustainability within a sector increasingly defined by consolidation and loss of other rural-serving hospitals.
