Youth Solutions already receives funding annually through the LEO budget as part of the At-Risk Youth Line item. 

Dear Michigan Legislature,

On behalf of Michigan Works! system, I am pleased to express our support for Youth Solutions' and the Jobs For Michigan's Graduates program and their request for \$8 million in the 2025-2026 State budget to support expanding career development in Michigan's K-12 education system while strengthening connections to and support of the workforce development system.

Michigan faces a critical talent shortage, low graduation rates, below-average postsecondary credential attainment, and increasing youth disconnection. Addressing these challenges requires stronger alignment between education and workforce development, yet gaps remain in early career exposure, work-based learning opportunities, and direct connections to Michigan's workforce system.
