Students participate in Unified Sports, Inclusive Youth Leadership Activities and Whole School Awareness events that celebrate students and provide them a place to learn and thrive together. 96% of Unified Champion School Liaisons say the Unified Champion

Schools strategy reduces bullying and offensive language. Special Olympics Michigan is a leader in UCS across the U.S. and will utilize funding to support schools in their Unified Champion Schools strategies to engage their students, teachers and communities.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS MICHIGAN

UNIFIED CHAMPION SCHOOLS FUNDING

ISSUE:

Since 2014, Special Olympics Michigan Unified Champion Schools (UCS) has been supported by the Michigan Department of Education to offer the Unified Champion Schools strategy to create more inclusive schools. To date, 622 schools are Special Olympics Unified Champion Schools. Special Olympics has been funded at \$500,000 annually. In 2024, Special Olympics Michigan received \$1 million to be distributed statewide.

Special Olympics Michigan currently has a Unified Champion School in 55counties in the state of Michigan and they are committed to having a Unified Champion School in every county by 2025. Special Olympics has learned that once a school utilizes the UCS strategy in an area, other schools are more likely to join.

KEY POINTS:

Special Olympics Unified Champion Schools® is a strategy to engage schools, pre-K through college, in climates of social inclusion, acceptance, respect and human dignity for all students with and without intellectual & developmental disabilities. Unified Champion Schools bring students together in three core areas to create school environments of inclusion and acceptance: Unified Sports, Inclusive Youth Leadership and whole-school Inclusion activities. These three elements create an environment for students to create meaningful friendships that carry over into the classroom and beyond. Research shows that 96% of educators state that the Unified Champion Schools strategy has made their school more inclusive.

ACTION:

Special Olympics Michigan has received \$500,000 annually since 2014 and is seeking an additional \$500,000 in 2025 to reach more schools. **That million-dollar investment is to grow Michigan as the most inclusive state in the nation to include every county!**


