In 2025, the Department will be constructing a new fire hall facility located in the Breckenridge Industrial Park, centrally located between Breckenridge and Wheeler.

The BWTFRD has obtained competitive bids from local contractors through a general contractor to construct the new stand-alone facility. This project is \$3,131,850.00. The department has set aside funds totaling approximately \$1,130,000.00 and approximately \$1,000,000.00 in additional funds from grants and donations. The department is looking to secure the remaining \$1,000,000.00 in funding through community donations and/or through a municipal bond with repayment terms.







Porter Township, Midland County, M August 3, 2024

RE: BRECKENRIDGE-WHEELER TOWNSHIP FIRE AND RESCUE DEPARTMENT (BWTRFD)

As a small rural township, Porter Township, Midland County, does not have a large enough tax base to be able to independently afford to run a municipal fire and rescue department. It is because of this we depend on the BWTFRD to protect our little over 1,100 residents (approximately 430 households).

Our township borders Gratiot County along the south side and our next closest option for fire/rescue support lies in Lee Township to the north. Because two of our area rivers cross horizontally between the Lee Township Fire Station and most of our township, the response time from their location is not ideal for many of the residents. We rely on BWTFRD to be able to quickly get to the site of the fire/accident as they have in the past.

We have had a great working relationship with Breckenridge/ Wheeler, Fire/Rescue and plan to continue to count on and support them.

With equipment and operation costs increasing yearly, understandably our standby fee for fire and rescue coverage has increased and the board made the difficult decision to go to our residents to ask for, and hopefully pass, a 1 mill increase in property tax to cover this standby fee. If this millage does not pass the board may have to impose a special assessment to cover these costs. Still, these options are far less expensive for our residents then starting our own fire and rescue station. We need to be especially conscientious of increases to the cost of our residents because approximately 10 percent of our senior residents are already considered at the poverty level of income.

We understand how important it is for equipment to be upgrade for the safety of the first responders we count on when we need them. It is critical to be in compliance with all the ever-changing technologies needed to keep the public safe. We hope you will consider granting funds to the Breckenridge-Wheeler Township Fire and Rescue Department to help sustain a robust public safety program.
