Michigan is in the middle of a skilled labor shortage, which contributes to the increased cost of housing. In Michigan, there are 58,011 license holders (builders and maintenance and alteration). The average age of a licensee is 56.42 years. In the 56+ age there are 23,586 licenses. In the 18-34 age group there are 2389 licenses. We need to do more to create awareness of the career opportunities available in the trades. This is a continuation

of the previous funding we have received. In FY 23 we received a line item of 2M, and in FY 24 we received \$400,000.00. The \$2M allowed us to distribute books to every 8-12 grader in the state. The \$400K is being used to distribute a book to every 8th grader in the state.
