**RE:** State University Graduation Rates

This memo provides data on current and historical graduation rates at state universities in Michigan, identifies factors influencing graduation rates, provides comparisons with graduation rates at similar institutions, discusses limitations associated with graduation rates, and provides an alternate degree completion measure.

#### **Current Graduation Rate Data**

Graduation rates are reported by higher education institutions on an annual basis to the federal government as a condition of eligibility to participate in federal financial aid programs (Pell Grants, Stafford Loans, etc.). Data on institutions' graduation rates are available through the federal Integrated Postsecondary Education System (IPEDS). These rates measure the percentage of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students at an institution earning a degree from that institution within a specified time period.

Attachment 1 shows the most recent four-, five-, and six-year graduation rates for Michigan's 15 public universities. The universities are ranked based on their six-year graduation rates, which are the most frequently cited. The rates are based on the cohort of students entering college in 1998—graduating by 2004 for the six-year graduation rates.

For each time period, the graduation rates vary substantially across the 15 universities:

- From 6.6 percent to 67.2 percent at the four-year level
- From 21.4 percent to 84.3 percent at the five-year level
- From 31.7 percent to 86.6 percent at the six-year level

UM-Ann Arbor's rates are substantially higher than the other universities' rates, particularly at the four-year level. This reflects, among other things, that a very high percentage of UM-Ann Arbor's undergraduate students enroll for a full load of courses (30 credit hours per academic year).

The overall graduation rate for the 15 universities—weighted based on the number of incoming students at each university—increases from 28.2 percent at the four-year level to 51.7 percent at the five-year level to 58.7 percent at the six-year level. Each of these rates is higher than the national average for public, four-year institutions. The gap is highest at the six-year level, at which Michigan's rate is 5.5 percentage points higher than the national rate.

#### **Historical Graduation Rate Data**

Attachment 2 shows the six-year graduation rates for Michigan's state universities from 1997 to 2004. (The year of the data refers to the deadline for a student to graduate for the six-year rate.) Fourteen of the fifteen universities show improvement in their graduation rates over this time period. The exception is Wayne State, which did not report graduation rates prior to 2002; it appears that

reporting was voluntary up until that point. The largest improvement was experienced by Northern, whose rate increased by 9.4 percentage points, from 35.7 percent in 1997 to 45.1 percent in 2004.

#### **Factors Influencing Graduation Rates**

Researchers have identified a number of factors that are statistically correlated to institutions' graduation rates. Using a regression analysis, the Education Trust identified the following 11 factors as having an influence on graduation rates:

- Estimated median SAT or ACT equivalent of freshman class
- Admissions selectivity
- Carnegie classification
- Percent of undergraduates receiving Pell Grants
- Public vs. private sector
- Number of full-time equivalent (FTE) undergraduates
- Student-related expenditures per FTE student
- Percent of FTE undergraduate students age 25 or over
- Status as a historically black college or university
- Percent of undergraduates who are enrolled part-time
- Status as a commuter campus<sup>1</sup>

These factors vary in their level of influence on graduation rates. The Education Trust identifies the percent of undergraduates receiving Pell Grants as the factor with the highest level of influence on graduation rates.

### **Comparisons with Graduation Rates at Similar Institutions**

Utilizing the 11 factors above, the Education Trust has created an algorithm that identifies the 15 most similar institutions for a given higher education institution, allowing for graduation rate comparisons with those comparable institutions. Attachment 3 shows the results of this comparison for Michigan's 15 state universities, downloaded from the trust's website (<a href="http://www.collegeresults.org">http://www.collegeresults.org</a>). Note that the rates in this attachment are based on 2003 graduation rate data; the comparisons have not been updated with 2004 data yet.

## **Data Limitations Associated with Graduation Rates**

Graduation rates measure the percentage of first-time, full-time, degree-seeking students entering an institution who go on to earn a degree at that institution within a specified time period. Part-time students are not included. While the rates are based on standard definitions, differences may exist in how postsecondary institutions classify students as degree-seeking or non-degree-seeking.

The rates are institution-based, rather than student-based. They do not account for students transferring out of the particular institution and subsequently earning a degree at another institution or students transferring into the particular institution and subsequently earning a degree. For example, a student earning two years of credit at a community college, but not applying to receive an associate's degree, and then transferring to earn a bachelor's degree at a state university would not be reflected as a graduate in either the community college's or the university's graduation rates.

Accounting for these different degree paths would require a postsecondary student record-based database. While some states have endeavored to create such databases, neither the State of Michigan nor the federal government has taken this step to date.

A recent study based on student-record level data available for a national sample of students graduating from high school in 1992 found the following:

- A third of traditional-age students who started in a four-year college earned a bachelor's degree from the same school in the "traditional" four-year period.
- Between 54 and 58 percent earned the degree from the same school in which they began within six years of entry.
- When the option of earning a degree from a different four-year college than the one in which these students commenced study, the six-year completion rates are in the 62–67 percent range.
- Only the NELS:88/2000 [the study based on the class of 1992] extends the time period for earning a degree beyond six years; at 8.5 years, its degree completion rate for students who started in a four-year college approaches 70 percent.<sup>2</sup>

Graduation rates provide the broadest measure of degree completion at the individual student level possible based on current available data for Michigan postsecondary institutions. They do not, however, capture all degree activity occurring in the realm of postsecondary education.

#### **Alternate Degree Completion Measure**

One of the limitations associated with graduation rates is that the rates only capture a subset of instructional activity occurring at a university. An alternate degree completion measure is a university's ratio of degrees completions to fiscal year equated students (FYES). This measure captures all enrollment and degree completions at each university.

Attachment 4 shows the ratio of undergraduate degree completions to FYES at each state university in FY 2004-05. The degrees column of the spreadsheet includes bachelor's degrees granted plus half of associate's degrees granted, to reflect that associate's degree program are generally half the length of bachelor's degree programs. The ratios of the fifteen universities range from 0.15 to 0.24, with UM-Ann Arbor having the highest ratio.

While this ratio does provide a broader measure of degree completion, it also tends to reward universities with higher numbers of students transferring into the university. Such a student could earn a bachelor's degree at the university without having enrolled for four years of instruction there. Also, this ratio would tend to benefit the four state universities that award associate's degrees, as some students enrolled at those institutions may earn both associate's and bachelor's degrees during the time of their enrollment.
