



## Financial Aid as % of Overall Higher Education Budget: FY 2009-10




#### Financial Aid Program Funding Amounts

### Development of Michigan's State Financial Aid System

- ☐ 1964: State Competitive Scholarship Program
- 1966: Tuition Grant Program
- 1986: Michigan Education Opportunity Grants
- 1986: Work Study Program
- □ 1986: Part-Time Independent Student Program
- 1986: Tuition Incentive Program
- □ 1999: Merit Award Program
- □ 2002: Nursing Scholarship Program
- 2005: Children of Veterans Tuition Grant Program (moved from Department of Military and Veterans Affairs)
- □ 2006: Promise Grant Program (replacing Merit Award Program)

Note: Bolded programs have appropriations in FY 2009-10 budget act.

#### State Competitive Scholarship Program

- ☐ FY 2009-10 Appropriation: \$17.6 million
- □ Funded primarily with GF/GP; appropriation includes \$2.9 million in federal funds, but approximately \$1.4 million will be forfeited due to overall reduction in need-based aid
- Awards made to students at both public/independent institutions meeting two major criteria:
  - Qualifying score on ACT (composite score of 23)
  - Financial need (cost of attendance minus expected family contribution)
- □ 34,200 students received awards in FY 2008-09
- Maximum award reduced from \$1,300 to \$510 for FY 2009-10

#### **Tuition Grant Program**

- ☐ FY 2009-10 Appropriation: \$31.7 million GF/GP
- Awards made to students attending independent colleges and universities based on financial need (cost of attendance minus expected family contribution)
- ☐ Funds also used for supplemental awards to Competitive Scholarship winners attending independent institutions
- 42,092 students received standard or supplemental awards in FY 2008-09
- ☐ Changes for FY 2009-10:
  - Awards to graduate students eliminated (\$4.5 million in FY 2008-09)
  - Cap of \$3.0 million per institution (affects students at Baker College and Davenport University: \$21.1 million and \$6.8 million in FY 2008-09)
  - Maximum award for students at other institutions reduced from \$2,100 to \$1,610

#### Tuition Incentive Program

- FY 2009-10 Appropriation: \$31.2 million (primarily Merit Award Trust Fund revenue)
- Created as incentive for low-income students to graduate from high school; Medicaid-eligible individuals may apply beginning in 6<sup>th</sup> grade
- ☐ Two phases:
  - Phase I: Program pays associate's/certificate program tuition costs at community college or four-year institution (amount limited at independent institutions)
  - Phase II: Program pays \$500/semester toward completion of bachelor's degree for up to four semesters
- Number of participants has grown from 3,318 in FY 2000-01 to 13,957 in FY 2008-09 due to large pool of potential participants
- □ Approximately 70% of participants attend community colleges

#### Other Financial Aid Programs


- Project GEAR UP: \$1.5 million
   Federally-funded awards targeted to students in urban school districts who have participated in college-exposure programs
- Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship Program: \$1.5 million
   Federally-funded awards to academically-outstanding high school graduates
- ☐ Children of Veterans Tuition Grant Program: \$1.0 million
  Grants to children of deceased or disabled veterans; funded by combination of income tax form check-off box contributions and GF/GP funding

### Financial Aid Programs Eliminated for FY 2009-10

- Michigan Promise Grant Program (FY 2009-10 Exec Rec: \$140.0 million) Awards of \$4,000 to students completing two years of postsecondary education; \$2,000 available over first two years of college based on performance on Michigan Merit Exam.
- ☐ *Michigan Work Study Program: (FY 2008-09: \$7.3 million)*Allocations to institutions for need-based work study opportunities
- ☐ Part-time Independent Student Program (FY 2008-09: \$2.7 million)
  Need-based awards to adult, part-time, independent students
- ☐ *Michigan Education Opportunity Grants (FY 2008-09: \$2.1 million)*Need-based awards for students at public universities/colleges
- Nursing Scholarship Program (FY 2008-09: \$4.25 million)
   Awards to nursing students agreeing to undertake nursing careers in Michigan

FY 2009-10 Estimates: Total State Funding of \$78.6 million




### Proposed Financial Aid Changes Under FY 2010-11 Executive Recommendation

- ☐ State Competitive Scholarship Program
  Remove \$1.4 million in forfeited federal funds
- ☐ Tuition Grant Program

  Eliminate funding for program: reduction of \$31.7 million GF/GP
- ☐ Tuition Incentive Program
  - Limit reimbursed tuition costs for associate's degree students at public universities to average community college tuition rate (reduction of \$6.2 million)
  - Eliminate Phase II of program (reduction of \$1.1 million)
  - Proposed reductions would offset projected cost growth of \$6.2 million
- □ Children of Veterans and Officer's Survivor Programs
  Increase line by \$200,000 GF/GP for transfer of Officer's Survivor Tuition Program from State Police budget and projected cost growth for Children of Veterans Tuition Grant Program
