Each **Summary** contains line-by-line detail, including the amount and purpose of each appropriation line and information regarding related boilerplate sections, for a specific appropriation act. Following the line item detail, a brief explanation of each boilerplate section in the appropriation bill is provided.

In this report, line item vetoes are presented in the following manner: appropriation amounts shown in strikeout are those that appear in the enrolled bill; amounts shown directly below strikeout amounts reflect the effect of the veto.

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## **GLOSSARY: State Budget Terms**

#### STATE BUDGET TERMS

**Gross Appropriations (Gross):** The total of all applicable appropriations (statutory spending authorizations) in a budget bill.

Adjusted Gross Appropriations (Adjusted Gross): The net amount of all gross appropriations after subtracting interdepartmental grants (IDGs) and intradepartmental transfers (IDTs).

**Lapses:** Appropriation amounts that are unspent/unobligated at the end of a fiscal year. Appropriations are automatically terminated at the end of a fiscal year unless otherwise provided by law.

**Work Project:** A statutorily-authorized account which allows a spending authorization to be carried over from one fiscal year to a succeeding fiscal year or years— i.e., allows funds to be spent over a period of years.

#### **APPROPRIATION BILL TERMS**

**Line Item:** Specific funding amount in an appropriation bill which establishes spending authorization for a particular program or function (may be for a single purpose or for multiple purposes).

**Boilerplate:** Specific language sections in an appropriation bill which direct, limit or restrict line item expenditures, express legislative intent, and/or require reports.

#### **REVENUE SOURCES**

**General Fund/General Purpose (GF/GP):** Unrestricted General Fund revenue available to fund any activity accounted for in the General Fund; unused GF/GP revenue lapses to the General Fund at the end of a fiscal year.

**State Restricted (Restricted):** State revenue restricted by state law or outside restriction that is available only for specified purposes; at year-end, unused restricted revenue remains in the restricted fund.

Federal Revenue: Federal grant or matchable revenue dedicated to specific programs.

Local Revenue: Revenue from local units of government.

**Private Revenue:** Revenue from non-government entities: rents, royalties or interest payments, payments from hospitals or individuals, and gifts and bequests.

**Interdepartmental Grant (IDG):** Revenue or funds received by one state department from another state department (usually for a service provided by the receiving department).

**Intradepartmental Transfer (IDT):** Transfers or funds being provided from one appropriation unit to another in the same department.

#### MAJOR STATE FUNDS

**Budget Stabilization Fund (BSF):** The countercyclical economic and budget stabilization fund; also known as the "rainy day" fund.

**School Aid Fund (SAF):** A restricted fund; the primary funding source for K-12 schools and Intermediate School Districts (ISDs).

**General Fund:** The General Fund (funded from taxes and other general revenue) is used to account for the ordinary operations of a governmental unit that are not accounted for in another fund.

## HIGHER EDUCATION

The Higher Education budget act contains appropriations to support the operations of the state's 15 public universities, fulfilling the requirement of Article VIII, Section 4 of the State Constitution. Additionally, the act contains funding for need- and merit-based financial aid for students attending public and independent colleges and universities in the state and several other higher education-related programs.

## SECTIONS 102 TO 116: STATE UNIVERSITIES

The Higher Education budget act contains a separate appropriation unit for each of the 15 state universities. Each unit includes a grant to the university for operations. Michigan State University's appropriation unit also includes appropriations for the Agricultural Experiment Station and Cooperative Extension Service operated by the university.

No statutory provisions exist to govern the distribution of state funding to state universities; decisions are made by the Legislature on an annual basis. In recent years, methods used to determine university funding amounts have included across-the-board adjustments, per-student floor funding, and a funding model based on enrollment, degree completions, and research funding.

## **SECTION 119: GRANTS AND FINANCIAL AID**

This appropriation unit contains funding for need- and merit-based financial aid programs for Michigan residents. The Michigan Merit Award Board has statutory authority over the Merit Award Program. The Michigan Higher Education Assistance Authority has statutory authority over the remaining financial aid programs—other than the Tuition Incentive Program, which does not have a permanent governing statute. These financial aid programs are administered by the Department of Treasury.

The unit also includes funding for the MiLEAD program, a grant program administered by the Department of Natural Resources.

## **BOILERPLATE SECTION INFORMATION**

#### Sec. 201. Payments to Locals

Reports spending from state resources and payments to local units of government.

#### Sec. 202. Management and Budget Act

Subjects funds appropriated to Management and Budget Act.

#### Sec. 208. Reporting by Internet

Requires institutions of higher education to use Internet to submit reports.

#### Sec. 209. Foreign Goods and Services

Prohibits use of funds to purchase foreign goods or services if American products competitively priced and of similar quality are available; states preference for goods and services produced by Michigan businesses.

#### Sec. 212. Payment of Appropriations

Provides for 11 monthly payments to universities; directs Department of Treasury to withhold appropriations if universities fail to submit HEIDI data by specified deadlines.

#### Sec. 213. Federal or Private Funds

Appropriates federal or private funds received by the state for the use of a college or university.

#### Sec. 214. Tuition Tax Credit

Requires state universities to submit Michigan Tuition Tax Credit notification to fiscal agencies.

#### Sec. 215. Provision of Information

Requires state universities to furnish program/financial information to state budget director and appropriations committees.

#### Sec. 301. State Competitive Scholarships

Provides for distribution of funds appropriated for State Competitive Scholarships.

#### Sec. 302. Tuition Grants

Provides for distribution of funds appropriated for Tuition Grants; requires maximum grant amount of at least \$2,000; provides that unexpended funds at close of FY 2006-07 remain available for expenditure in FY 2007-08.

#### Sec. 303. Michigan Work-Study Program

Provides for allocation of funds appropriated for the Work-Study Program.

#### Sec. 307. Audit of Independent Institutions

Allows auditor general to audit selected enrollments, degrees, and awards at independent colleges and universities receiving financial aid awards.

#### Sec. 308. Financial Aid Payment Schedules

Specifies quarterly payment schedules for the various financial aid programs.

#### Sec. 309. Needs Analysis Criteria

Requires Michigan Higher Education Assistance Authority (MHEAA) to determine the needs analysis criteria for students to qualify for State Competitive Scholarships and Tuition Grants.

#### Sec. 310. Tuition Incentive Program

Specifies criteria for Tuition Incentive Program eligibility; provides for award conditions and limits under Phases I and II of the program.

#### Sec. 311. Independent Institution Data

Requires independent colleges and universities to make data regarding grants available to Legislature and state budget director.

#### Sec. 312. Nursing Scholarship Program

Provides for MHEAA to administer any nursing scholarship or grant programs authorized by state statute; requires awards to master's degree nursing students, subject to same statutory requirements as undergraduate students.

#### Sec. 313. MiLEAD Program

Provides for grants of up to \$1.0 million each to higher education institutions under MiLEAD initiative; requires annual report by grant recipients to Department of Natural Resources; designates appropriation as work project.

#### Sec. 314. Children of Veterans Tuition Grant Program

Requires annual report from MHEAA on grants made under Children of Veterans Tuition Grant Program.

#### Sec. 402. Douglas Lake Biological Station

Designates University of Michigan Douglas Lake Biological Station as a unique resource.

#### Sec. 405. HEIDI Advisory Committee

Designates funds appropriated for maintenance of HEIDI database established in statute; requires advisory committee to meet regularly to review data definitions and requirements.

#### Sec. 418. State University Funding Model

Describes state university funding model calculations; model includes enrollment-, degree-, and research-based components; states intent to review performance indicators that reflect uniqueness of universities' missions.

#### Sec. 426. Textbook Lists

States legislative intent regarding access to required textbook lists by private bookstores and use of funds in university-administered accounts by students at private bookstores.

#### Sec. 433. Project GREEEN

Earmarks funds from Agricultural Experiment Station and Cooperative Extension appropriations for Project GREEEN (Generating Research and Extension to meet Environmental and Economic Needs); requires report.

#### Sec. 436. Tuition Restraint

States legislative intent that universities increase institutional financial aid expenditures by at least the same percentage as resident undergraduate tuition/fees; requires universities to report on those increases.

#### Sec. 440. Tuition Rate Reports

Requires tuition and fee data to be submitted to HEIDI database by August 31, 2005; requires report on revision to tuition and fees within 15 days of adoption.

#### Sec. 450. Floor Funding

States that \$3,775-per-fiscal year equated student funding floor is reflected in line item appropriations for all universities, except for Grand Valley due to limited state resources.

#### Sec. 461. Bay Mills Indian Tuition Waiver Funding

Requires \$100,000 payment from Lake Superior State's operations appropriation to Bay Mills Community College for costs of Indian Tuition Waiver Program.

#### Sec. 501. Martin Luther King, Jr. – Cesar Chavez – Rosa Parks (KCP) Future Faculty Program

Provides for program intended to increase number of minority candidates pursuing faculty teaching careers.

#### Sec. 502. KCP College Day Program

Provides for program intended to introduce schoolchildren underrepresented in postsecondary education to the potential of a college education.

#### Sec. 503. KCP Select Student Support Services Program

Provides for program intended to develop academically and economically disadvantaged student retention programs.

#### Sec. 504. KCP College/University Partnership Program

Provides for program intended to increase the number of academically and economically disadvantaged students who transfer from community colleges to baccalaureate institutions.

#### Sec. 505. KCP Visiting Professors Program

Provides for program intended to increase the number of minority instructors and provide role models for minority students.

#### Sec. 506. KCP Morris Hood, Jr. Educator Development Program

Provides for program intended to increase the number of minority students, especially males, enrolling in and completing K-12 teacher education programs.

#### Sec. 507. Reallocation of KCP Funds

Provides for reallocation of funds from institutions that do not fully expend their funds to institutions that need additional funding.

#### Sec. 601. Information to High Schools

Requires state universities to inform Michigan high schools regarding the academic status of students from each high school.

#### Sec. 602. Information to Community Colleges

Requires state universities to inform Michigan community colleges regarding the academic status of community college transfer students.

#### Sec. 701. Audit of HEIDI Data

Requires auditor general to review HEIDI data; excludes certain credit hours from those reported to HEIDI.

#### Sec. 701a. Degree Programs

Lists new degree programs established by state universities for which credit hours can be reported to HEIDI.

#### Sec. 702. Responses to Audit Reports

Requires state universities to report on implementation of audit report recommendations.

#### Sec. 708. Performance Audits

Permits auditor general to conduct performance audits of state universities.

#### Sec. 709. Crime Statistics

Requires universities to make materials prepared in accordance with federal crime and campus security reporting requirements available through the Internet.

#### Sec. 711. Education Degrees

Requires state universities to report on efforts to increase number of education degrees conferred for teaching math, science, foreign languages, and other critical shortage disciplines.

#### Sec. 712. Research, Technology Transfer, and High-Tech Graduates

Requires state universities to report various data items related to research funding, technology transfer, and advanced degrees in math, science, health care, and engineering.
