2023 EGLE FEE SUNSETS

FAST FACTS

- Almost half of EGLE's annual budget is funded by restricted revenue.
- Most of EGLE's restricted funds are supported by fees.
- 7 EGLE fees are scheduled to sunset in 2023.
- The sunsetting fees generate \$21.3 million in annual revenue for EGLE.
- Air, groundwater, and solid waste fees are among those scheduled for sunset in 2023.

INTRODUCTION

The Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) relies on state restricted funding to support almost half of its annual budget; 46.3% (\$337.4 million) of EGLE's FY 2022-23 gross appropriations (\$728.7 million) is funded by revenue from 52 restricted funds. Most of these funds receive proceeds from at least one of 59 fees charged by the department.

OVERVIEW OF FEES SCHEDULED TO SUNSET

Eighteen fees have sunsets specified in statute, which set the end date for collection; 7 fees are scheduled to sunset in 2023, and 11 fees are scheduled to sunset in 2025. (The remaining 41 fees have no sunset.) Fees expiring in 2023 generate \$21.3 million in annual revenue. Table 1, below, provides an overview of these fees. Each is described in more detail following the table.

Legislative action is required if these fees are to be collected beyond their respective sunset dates. The legislature may eliminate a sunset or extend it to a future date; all of the above sunsets were extended most recently by four years from 2019 to 2023. No action is required if the legislature wishes for a fee to sunset as scheduled.

Groundwater Discharge Permit

Sewer Expedited Permit

Tire Disposal Surcharge
