



### **Employment in Michigan**


In the August 2024 payroll survey of employers, Michigan lost approximately **2,200 jobs** (total nonfarm) making it three straight months of job losses. (*NOTE: Auto strikes and associated layoffs are reflected in October 2023 data*).

#### **Unemployment Rate**


The August 2024 survey of household employment had Michigan's **unemployment rate** increase 0.1 percentage points to **4.5%**, which is 0.3 percentage points above the national rate of 4.2% in August. The labor force decreased by about 7,200 workers. Approximately 12,000 fewer people reported being employed and approximately 4,700 additional people reported being unemployed.

#### **Pandemic Jobs Rebound**


Michigan has added back just under 1.1 million jobs from the pandemic low point in April 2020, and is now approximately **39,000**, or **0.9%**, above the pre-pandemic level in February 2020. *Note: Revised figures show that Michigan crossed the pre-pandemic level initially in April 2023*.
