



## **Employment in Michigan**


In the May 2024 payroll survey of employers, Michigan gained approximately **7,900 jobs** (total nonfarm). (*NOTE: Auto strikes and associated layoffs are reflected in October 2023 data*).

## **Unemployment Rate**


The May 2024 survey of household employment had Michigan's **unemployment rate** holding at **3.9%**, slightly below the national rate of 4.0% in May. The labor force increased by about 2,500 workers. Approximately 1,300 additional people reported being employed and approximately 1,300 additional people reported being unemployed.

#### **Pandemic Jobs Rebound**


Michigan has added back over 1.1 million jobs from the pandemic low point in April 2020, and is now approximately **55,200**, or **1.2%**, above the pre-pandemic level in February 2020. *Note: Revised figures show that Michigan crossed the pre-pandemic level initially in April 2023*.
