


#### Michigan Achievement Scholarship Data Dashboard 2023-2024


# **Action Plan**



# 1 Lower Costs

- 217% increase in student financial aid since 2019
- 4 new scholarships
  - → Reconnect
  - → Futures for Frontliners
  - → Mi Future Educator Fellowship
  - → Michigan Achievement Scholarship

### **Support Success**

#### Investments

- First ever investments in student basic needs and support for colleges to adopt best practices for success
- \$45M to support student success in FY 24 alone

## Policy

- First ever requirements to implement and/or incentives to adopt best practices
- Eliminated remedial education for Reconnectors
- Expanded credit for prior learning for Reconnectors
- Created Michigan Center for Adult College Success

## **Support Student Success**



- Launching a cross-sector Student Basic Needs Task Force to review national best practice and identify possible actions in Michigan (in collaboration with the Joyce Foundation)
- Participating in conversations about dual enrollment (in collaboration with MCCA)
- Co-designed grant programs with partners to maximize state investment

## **Community College Guarantee**

#### **Big Goals**

- All high school graduates have the opportunity earn a skill certificate or associate degree tuition-free and have a more affordable pathway to a four-yeardegree.
- Achieve Sixty by 30 goal.

#### Why?

- Cost (and perceived cost) is still a major barrier to pursing a degree or certificate.
- Higher paying jobs require education after high school, and everyone deserves a path to prosperity.

#### How?

 Update the Michigan Achievement Scholarship eligibility and award for students enrolling at community colleges.
