



Community College Guarantee

What is the Community College Guarantee?

- Launched: Fall 2024
- Goal: Provide last-dollar funding to cover tuition and fees for graduating seniors from Michigan high schools at in-state community colleges to earn a skill certificate, associate degree or to start taking classes towards a bachelor's degree at their local community or Tribal college.

Eligibility Criteria

- Michigan high school graduates (classes of 2023 and 2024)
- Enroll full-time at a Michigan community college within 15 months of graduation


Program Goals

- Increase postsecondary attainment rates
- Reduce financial barriers to higher education
- Strengthen Michigan's workforce pipeline

CCG: Investing in Michigan's future Workforce

- Community College Guarantee is saving 18,226 students \$2,134 per year in tuition and fees, on average.
- Michigan Achievement Scholarship Funding Awarded FY24-25
 - Community & Tribal Colleges: 15.41%
 - Private: 13.5%
 - Public: 71.09%


Michigan Achievement Scholarships Amount Awarded by Institution Type

Completion Highlights

- Michigan community colleges doubled completion rates for new fulltime students between 2010 and 2020.
- The success rate for students who started college in 2020–21 is 38.4% with an addition 22% of students continuing toward their degree.
- 5,595 Reconnect students have completed a certificate or associate degree and 24,487 students are still pursuing a degree.

MiLEAP Student Success Grants

Example: Keweenaw Bay Ojibwa Community College (KBOCC), \$997,872

KBOCC aims to empower Tribal and surrounding communities through education and cultural
preservation, focusing on preparing students for careers in STEM fields like nursing, health sciences, and
environmental science. As a rural Tribal Community College, many of our students are from underserved
populations underrepresented in STEM. Our campus faces space limitations and outdated
infrastructure, hindering our ability to meet growing student needs in science and technology. This
proposal seeks funding to renovate and expand our science labs and technology facilities, enhancing
institutional capacity and enriching students' educational experience. These upgrades will optimize high
impact practices and learning environments, boost success in STEM courses, and equip our students to
excel academically and succeed in their future careers.

Budget Requests: MiLEAP

- Support \$15 million for additional student success efforts
- Continue funding Michigan Reconnect at current levels
- Extend Michigan Reconnect to adults ages 21 to 24
- Improve access to dual enrollment by uncoupling it with the per pupil foundation allowance (MiLEAP, K-12 School Aid budgets)

Budget Requests: Community Colleges

- Increase community college operations funding by 4%
- Fully fund the Indian Tuition Waiver
- Invest \$45 million into Infrastructure, Technology, Equipment, Maintenance, Safety & Housing (ITEMS)

Budget Requests: Higher Education

- Sustain the Michigan Achievement Scholarship Community College Guarantee
- Continue to allow MiLEAP to use funds for Michigan Achievement Scholarship outreach
- Amend boilerplate language (Sec. 254) to change scholarship reimbursement payments to colleges from quarterly to monthly
- Fully fund the Tuition Incentive Program

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
