RE: Legislative Transfer Package 2024-8

Attached are legislative transfers proposed by the State Budget Office in a letter dated June 3, 2024. Pursuant to section 393 of the Management and Budget Act, a legislative transfer must be approved by a majority of both the House and Senate Appropriations Committees, with identical funding sources and dollar amounts, in order to become effective.

There are two basic types of legislative transfers, which have different effects on the overall level of appropriations in the state budget.

A **standard legislative transfer** shifts existing spending authorization between line items in a particular budget area, with no net change in total appropriations. Generally, such transfers are proposed when expenditures are higher than originally anticipated in one line item and lower than anticipated in another. These transfers can represent a shift of GF/GP funding between two line items, or merely a shift of spending authorization from some broad category of funding (federal, restricted, etc.) between the line items.

As shown in the attached table, standard transfers in this package total \$18.0 million, which will shift 0.02% of total appropriations within the existing FY 2023-24 year-to-date state budget.

A **contingency authorization transfer** increases total line item appropriations in a budget area by moving contingency spending authorization from the boilerplate section of a budget act to a specific line item in order to recognize additional federal, private, local, or state restricted revenue that has become available since the original enactment of the budget. Absent the contingency authorization transfer mechanism, this type of budget adjustment would be made through a supplemental appropriations bill.

As shown in the attached table, contingency authorization transfers in this package total \$7.65 million, which will increase the FY 2023-24 year-to-date state budget by 0.01%.

This transfer would provide funding for water and sewer system repairs and replacement at the Woodland Correctional Facility. Specifically, funding would be used to repair/replace water mains, sewer lines, boilers, pumps, and control systems. Funding is available from the Offender Success line item due to transferring costs for substance use disorder programming for parolees from the department to Medicaid-eligible Prepaid Inpatient Health Plans in the community. Funding is available from the Probation Residential Services line item due to the current referral rate for probation residential services being less than anticipated. Funding is available from various facility line items due to closed housing units resulting in savings from reduced staffing and operational costs. Funding is available from the Southern Region Administration and Support line item due to savings from staff vacancies.

This transfer request would authorize the department to expend \$3.5 million in federal revenues made available to the department for Contractual Services, Supplies, and Materials (CSS&M). Funds would support increased state contractual costs for maintaining and operating public assistance program income verification information technology systems. The FY 2024-25 executive budget recommendation for DHHS includes \$5.5 million Gross (\$3.9 million GF/GP) for this purpose in the subsequent fiscal year. As of June 4th, 2024, both the House and Senate have concurred with income verification appropriation recommendations in their respective FY 2024-25 budget proposals.

This transfer request would shift state restricted authorization from the Marihuana Regulatory Fund to the Marihuana Regulation Fund in the Investigative Services line item to align state restricted authorization with expected revenues. Estimated marihuana-related revenues have changed due to evolving market conditions and increased revenue from recreational marihuana sales. The Investigative Services line item supports investigative activities, which include inspections of marihuana licensees, and investigates criminal activity regarding state marihuana statutes among other types of special investigative activities.

The Marihuana Regulatory Fund receives revenue from application fees and regulatory assessments associated with licensing of medical marihuana facilities and is used to support administration and enforcement of the Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing Act. The Marihuana Regulation Fund receives revenue from fees collected under the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marihuana Act (2018 IL 1) and from a 10% excise tax levied on adult-use marihuana sales.

Revenue is collected from fees on various services including fingerprinting, criminal record checks, concealed pistol license applications, and FOIA fees. Revenue from fees is used to support expenses for responsibilities and activities required under the various public acts. Additional revenue will be used to support increased operating costs within the Michigan Intelligence Operations Center.
