Funding is available from the Probation Residential Services line item due to the current referral rate for probation residential services being less than anticipated. Funding is available from various facility line items due to closed housing units resulting in savings from reduced staffing and operational costs. Funding is available from the Southern Region Administration and Support line item due to savings from staff vacancies.

The FY 2024-25 executive budget recommendation for DHHS includes \$5.5 million Gross (\$3.9 million GF/GP) for this purpose in the subsequent fiscal year. As of June 4th, 2024, both the House and Senate have concurred with income verification appropriation recommendations in their respective FY 2024-25 budget proposals.

This transfer request would shift state restricted authorization from the Marihuana Regulatory Fund to the Marihuana Regulation Fund in the Investigative Services line item to align state restricted authorization with expected revenues. Estimated marihuana-related revenues have changed due to evolving market conditions and increased revenue from recreational marihuana sales. The Investigative Services line item supports investigative activities, which include inspections of marihuana licensees, and investigates criminal activity regarding state marihuana statutes among other types of special investigative activities.

The Marihuana Regulatory Fund receives revenue from application fees and regulatory assessments associated with licensing of medical marihuana facilities and is used to support administration and enforcement of the Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing Act. The Marihuana Regulation Fund receives revenue from fees collected under the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marihuana Act (2018 IL 1) and from a 10% excise tax levied on adult-use marihuana sales.
